#### Father Chuck's Corner

Greetings and God's blessings be yours on the **Solemnity of the Holy Trinity!** In reality today is simply a celebration of God-the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. The readings today are about who God is and how he relates to us. The first reading from Deuteronomy speaks of who God was to the Israelites, from creation through the burning bush and their deliverance from Egypt. "This is why you must now know, and fix in your heart, that the Lord is God in the heavens and on earth below, and that there is no other." Then in the second reading from Romans, Paul tells the people that if you are led by the Holy Spirit, you are considered children of God and can call God, "Abba, Father." "Brothers and sisters: Those who are led by the Spirit of God are sons of God." And finally, in Matthew's gospel we see Jesus, just before his ascension to heaven, telling the apostles to go forth and spread the "Good News" to all nations. "Go, therefore, and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you."

Today is a rejoicing in the God that in a certain sense, we know. This God is the Father who created all things, the Son who came to save us and the Spirit who dwells within us. This is the God who made himself known to the Jewish people and who rescued them time and time again. It is the God who spoke through their prophets. And it is the God who became one of us, walked among us and showed us what love truly looks like. This is the God who isn't distant, but rather is incredibly close. These are a few of the things we know about God, and this is the God we celebrate today. But there is also the "unknowable" God we celebrate today. It is the God we worship, contemplate, give thanks to and sit in awe of, the God who is mystery. This God is far beyond anything we can wrap our minds around. This is the God who can't be explained or put in a box or confined to a few statements of faith. This *God is, well.....God!* As Catholics we have many ways to talk about God. Ours is a rich history filled we deep spiritual truths, heartfelt prayers and holy reflections. And we have the official teachings of the Church, that are Spirit inspired and to which we are called to believe and embrace. Yes, we have been gifted with many insights into our loving God. And yes, we can say much about God. But never mistake what we say as a complete explanation of who God is

Knowing a little is not knowing a lot. Never mistake some insights with having every insight. Some words aren't sufficient to answer the deepest questions. They just aren't. God is always so much more than we can ever imagine, ever explain, or ever understand. Put simply, when it comes to talking about God, thinking about God, or wondering about God, we must always remember to hold on to the mystery. Be aware of what you don't know and let it all play out trusting that it will be well worth it in the end. What a God we have!

Next Sunday, June 2nd, is the Feast of Corpus Christi The Body and Blood of Jesus Christ). As part of our parish's Eucharistic Revival, we will have a special *Corpus Christi Procession* immediately following the 4:30pm Mass on Sunday. The Body of Christ will be carried in solemn procession from the church to the four shrines that adorn our grounds (Padre Pio, the Angel Garden, St. Therese, and the Holy Family). There will be prayers, intercessions, and Benediction at the Holy Family shrine. All are most welcome to come and share in this time-honored tradition for the Feast of Corpus Christi.

Please remember to take home a copy of the bulletin when you leave Mass today. It contains many items of interest and invitation, with something for everyone. Of special note is news and needs from Parish Social Ministry, info from Religious Education (Faith Formation), an ad about the upcoming *Parish Blood Drive* on Sunday morning, June 2nd in the school cafeteria, an invitation to the Corpus Christi Procession next Sunday, June 2<sup>nd</sup>, immediately following the 4:30pm Mass, an ad for the Stand-Up Comedy Night, sponsored by the Knights of Columbus on Saturday evening, June 7th, the *Eucharistic Revival* Centerfold, the Communal Prayer Before Mass (found on the inside back page of the bulletin), an invitation to join *FORMED* (your Catholic Faith on demand) and much more. To keep informed, keep a copy of the bulletin at home each week for quick and easy reference.

Have a great week. Smile, share, live in the mystery of the Blessed Trinity and remember: What's your sign? Mine is Father-Son-Holy Spirit. God bless always.






There is no Registration fee for Catechists. The teacher manuals are very user friendly and geared to adults who are not professional teachers.

# STEP BY STEP WALK THROUGH THE MASS DO THIS IN REMEMBRANCE OF ME FATHER LUKE SPANNAGEL NATIONAL EUCHARIST REVIVAL BLOG



#### Incense

As we continue through the Offertory of the Mass, we now come to the point where incense can be used. Some of us may like the incense, and others may not. Do you know what incense is made of and why we use it?

#### What is incense, and where does it come from?

According to the Catholic Source Book, "Frankincense... is the main ingredient in the incense used in today's liturgies. A resin produced by a family of desert trees that grow in southern Arabia, it is derived from a sap that dries, forming crystalline lumps of an amber/gold color. For Christians, it has a rich prayer and purification symbolism. From the earliest Christian days, it has been associated with Christ, beginning with the Magi's gift (Matthew 2:10-11). Even before that, the Jews regarded its rich spicy scent as a pure offering, pleasing to God" (p. 307). The author of Understanding the Mass, Charles Belmonte, adds, "Incense is a resinous substance which, when placed upon glowing charcoal, gives off a balsamic odor as it burns. It had a place in Israelite worship; in fact, the psalmist compares our prayers to the smoke of incense, rising up to heaven. In the Book of Revelation, it is seen as a symbol of the prayers of the saints" (Understanding the Mass, p. 50).

#### Where is incense mentioned in the Bible?

Besides the Book of Revelation, incense is mentioned in the Book of Numbers 7:14 as part of an offering for the dedication of the altar. Deuteronomy 33:10 makes reference to "the smoke of sacrifice." Exodus 30:34-38 describes blending aromatic substances with pure frankincense in equal parts, even describing how it should be ground into fine dust. In Revelation 5:8, St. John tells us the elders had "gold bowls filled with incense, which are the prayers of the holy ones." In another reference, Revelation 8:3-4 describes an angel with a gold censer: "He was given a great quantity of incense to offer, along with the prayers of all the holy ones... The smoke of the incense along with the prayers of the holy ones went up before God ... "Hopefully, it is clear from these passages that there is a connection between incense and prayer and sacrifice. When incense is used in the Mass, there are

times when it is clearly used to reverence people and things, which is especially clear when incense is used during the Offertory of the Mass. Referring to this part of the Mass, The General Instruction of the Roman Missal says, after the bread and wine are placed on the altar, "the Priest may incense the gifts placed on the altar and then incense the cross and the altar itself, so as to signify the Church's offering and prayer rising like incense in the sight of God. Next, the Priest, because of his sacred ministry, and the people, by reason of their baptismal dignity, may be incensed by the Deacon or by another minister" (GIRM, 75). As the Diocese of Peoria teaches, "this particular incense shows a connectedness between the altar of sacrifice. those offering the sacrifice, and those uniting themselves to the sacrifice. Before being incensed we bow not only as a sign of reverence but as a sign of affirmation that, like the incense, we offer our lives to God and pray they be lifted up and transformed" (A Study of the Mass, p. 12).

#### Why is incense used at Mass?

e older priest once said to me that he loves using incense to honor holy people and holy things. As he sees the smoke rising, he is mindful that we are gathered together as God's people in the Mass, joining Jesus in offering the perfect sacrifice to the Father. In the Mass, our prayers are joined together, and the incense gives us a visual reminder of those prayers being offered to God. He also mentioned he places one, two, or three spoons of incense (from the little container called an incense boat) onto the burning charcoal in the censer (sometimes called a thurible). For him, one spoonful calls to mind the Oneness of God; two spoonfuls point to the two natures of Christ (human and divine); and three indicate the three persons of the Trinity. For that priest, this is a simple way to recall core truths about God as we pray together in the Mass.

For Reflection: Read and pray with the Old Testament uses of incense. As you reflect on what you read, allow the historical uses of incense to enrich your understanding of the role of incense in the holy sacrifice of the Mass.

#### Why do we call Mary our Blessed Mother?

Have you ever wondered why we call her the Blessed Mother? In Sacred Scripture, after the angel Gabriel visits Mary in her home to tell her that she will bear the Savior of the world at the Annunciation, Mary visits her cousin Elizabeth, who calls Mary "the mother of my Lord" (Luke 1:43).

The Catechism of the Catholic Church teaches that because Mary is the mother of Jesus-and Jesus is Godshe has the beautiful privilege of being called "the Mother of God." She is not just the mother of His human nature; she is the mother of the whole Person of Christ, and Christ has two natures: human and divine. The Catechism explains:

"In fact, the One whom [Mary] conceived as man by the Holy Spirit, who truly became her son according to the flesh, was none other than the Father's eternal Son, the second person of the Holy Trinity. Hence the Church confesses that Mary is truly the 'Mother of God' (Theotokos)" (CCC 495).

We call Mary the Blessed Mother because of Sacred Scripture. When Mary visited her cousin, Elizabeth was filled with the Holy Spirit and cried out, "Blessed are you among women, and blessed is the fruit of your womb!" (Luke 1:42). And in her Song of Praise, popularly known as the Magnificat, Mary replied, "Behold, henceforth all generations will call me blessed" (Luke 1:48).

## And why do we call Mary our Mother, even though she is not our biological mother?

Since Mary gave birth to Jesus, who is the Head of the Mystical Body of Christ, and we are all members of His Body, she therefore brought us spiritually into being as sons and daughters of God. This fundamental truth is also why we have high regard for Mary. Before she said "yes" to God, we were not able to enter heaven. Her role in salvation history is crucial.

Mothers guide, nurture, and teach their children. The Blessed Mother guides, nurtures, and teaches us to become faithful followers of her Son, Jesus Christ.

#### **Eucharistic Witness**

"Modern man listens more willingly to witnesses than to teachers, and if he does listen to teachers, it is because they are witnesses." St. Paul VI Father John Riccardo Active Religious (†Living)

Fr. John Riccardo was ordained a priest of the Archdiocese of Detroit in 1996. In 2019, after 23 years in parish ministry, he founded a ministry called Acts XXIX to reflect that the Holy Spirit is writing the next chapter in the Acts of the Apostles at this moment through all of us. The Acts XXIX team conducts parish missions entitled "The Rescue Project" in order to proclaim the Gospel in a compelling way and to equip clergy and lay leaders for the age in which God has chosen us to live. What can we learn from Fr. John's Eucharistic witness:

Belief Intensifies Love: "I grew up in the seventies, so Eucharistic adoration and exposition was something that I was absolutely unfamiliar with, even having gone Catholic schools. After I had been ordained about a year and a half, I got involved teaching RCIA. I organized a retreat and each night, I would expose the Eucharist for hours and saw God was acting incredibly powerfully in peoples' lives. As I meditated during Eucharistic adoration, I heard Jesus say "John, don't you see how easy this is? You just have to put Me out and I'll work."

Feeding and Being Fed by Love: "Daily Eucharistic Adoration changed my life as a priest. From that moment on, everywhere I've gone, we've built an Adoration chapel. I've started doing Exposition every morning and inviting people to pray before the Blessed Sacrament. And encounter after encounter has happened because God wants this more than we do. We need to be in the daily habit of wasting time in a positive way with Him, of listening to His voice in silence and in Scripture, of praising Him, thanking Him, saying we're sorry, asking for help, asking for vision, and so much more."

Made for Love: "Often, during the Mass, at the moment of consecration, when I lift the bread and wine and it becomes the Body and Blood of Our Lord Jesus Christ, I often lose my breath and feel as if my heart is being squeezed. It is a reminder to me of the day God barged into my life and brought me to the joy of the priesthood."






