



Father Chuck's Corner

Greetings and God's blessings be yours on the Sixth Sunday in Ordinary Time! The readings today encourage us to trust that God knows what we yearn for. Every Sunday we are invited to Mass where we bring our needs before God. We come with our fears, anxieties, joys, and thanksgiving, and he welcomes us. He knows that we do not come empty-handed. When we walk into church, we carry with us all the emotions we face in our lives. In the first reading from the prophet Jeremiah, the people are told that it is useless to rely on the things of the world. Rather one should count on God above everyone and anything else. "Blessed is the one who trusts in the Lord, whose hope is the Lord." Then in the second reading Paul tells the Corinthians that if they are only concerned about this world, they are missing the whole point of who Jesus is and what he did. It is all about Jesus rising from the dead. "But now Christ has been raised from the dead, the first fruits of those who have fallen asleep." And finally, the gospel is Luke's version of the Beatitudes from the Sermon on the Plain. The words of Jesus are challenging but their overall effect is positive. uplifting and encouraging. "Blessed are you" is said over and over again which I would say sounds pretty good. Luke does something different from Matthew's Sermon on the Mount. He then includes a series of statements that bring into focus the flipsides of all the ways we can be blessed. And he uses the dreaded word "woe" to get his point across.

Living a life pleasing to God is not easy. Often, it's pretty difficult to know what to do in a given situation. All God asks is that we wrestle with whatever difficulties we are having in coming to clear understanding and then simply make the best choice we can. Now we can't always take this kind of uncertain approach to every choice. Sometimes the choice (from our conscience) is clear. Sometimes we do know what God wants from us in a given situation, yet we still try to talk ourselves into the choice we want. When we hear that voice loud and clear, when right or wrong is in sharp focus, let's be sure to choose "right," to choose what honestly reflects the "God-choice" and not the "me-choice." As Jeremiah put it: We can trust in the world and be cursed, or we can trust in God and be blessed. Most of us try to do the right thing when it's clear what the right thing is and begin the life God wants for us and from us; nothing less than a life of great

meaning, joy and blessedness.

Back to where you are at this Mass. The Eucharist offers us tremendous grace, a grace that invites us to feast in its fullness and be strengthened in our ability to trust in the Lord. So, whatever care you carried in here with, leave with the knowledge that you are not alone. Yearn with confidence in the Lord. Trust and grow in your understanding of God's tremendous love for you as you make the choices you face in life.

As part of our parish's program for the Eucharistic Revival, there will be a special eye-witness presentation of the 10th National Eucharistic Congress that was held last summer in Indianapolis. Several parishioners took part in this wonderful experience of witnessing the power and presence of the Eucharist in the life of the Church. As part of the "Light of the World" lecture series there will be a special evening presented by our parishioners who were there last summer. Come and hear their faith-filled experience of the Eucharistic Congress this coming Thursday evening, February 20th at 7:30pm in the school cafeteria.

Please take home a copy of the bulletin when you leave Mass today. There are many items of interest and invitation with something for everyone. Of special note is news and needs from Parish Social Ministry, info from Religious Educa*tion* (Faith Formation), the invitation to this week's *Light of the World* presentation on Thursday evening, the next Holy Hour which will be on Tuesday evening, February 25th, information about the upcoming St. Patrick's Celebration, sponsored by the Knights of Columbus on Saturday, March 22nd, details about the 2025 Sodality of Our Lady Scholarship Exam, the Eucharistic Revival Centerfold, the Communal Prayer Before Mass (found on the inside back cover), an invitation to join *FORMED* (your Catholic Faith on demand) and much more. To keep informed, keep a copy of the bulletin at home each week for quick and easy reference.

Showing the Host Part 2

Last week, we began our discussion of the part of the Mass that is referred to as the "Showing of the Host" or the "Elevation." The "Showing of the Host" is a moment when the priest elevates the consecrated bread, which is the Body of Christ, for the congregation to see.

This occurs after the consecration, during the Eucharistic Prayer. The act serves as a visual reminder of Christ's sacrifice and invites the faithful to reflect on the sacred mystery of the Eucharist. It is followed by a period of reverence, with the congregation either kneeling or standing in silent prayer or song, acknowledging the presence of Christ in the Eucharist. At this point, the priest raises the chalice with the host and proclaims these words of St. John the Baptist:

"Behold the Lamb of God, behold him who takes away the sins of the world. Blessed are those called to the supper of the Lamb." -John 1:29

Our Response and Reception

As the Diocese of Peoria teaches, "We respond to this invitation of the priest to receive the Lord Jesus in the Holy Eucharist with humility. Like the centurion servant who recognized himself unworthy to have the Lord 'under his roof' to heal his child, it calls to mind our humility—and the Lord's divine majesty that He can do this work despite our weaknesses" (A Study of the Mass, p. 19). As Edward Sri, the author of A Biblical Walk

Through the Mass notes, these words of the centurion are also a prayer that "expresses a great faith that surpasses many others in the gospels and amazes even Jesus: he believes Jesus can heal from afar, simply by speaking his word... Jesus praises this man for his faith. Just like the centurion, we recognize our unworthiness to have Jesus come under the 'roof' of our souls in holy communion. Yet just as the centurion believed Jesus was able to heal his servant, so do we trust that Jesus can heal us as he becomes the most intimate guest of our soul in the Eucharist" (p. 142).

The Diocese of Peoria reminds us: "it is for this reason that Jesus came into the world, as 'people who are well do not need doctors, sick people do!"



'I have come to seek out those who are lost!' In the Holy Eucharist, Jesus seeks us out! He comes to our doors and He knocks. Our reception of Communion is an opportunity to allow Him into our hearts..." (A Study of the Mass, p. 19).

The Lord Jesus, of course, knows our failings. That he wants us anyway is what makes his love so powerful and so amazing. That he would offer his very Body to us is even more amazing. It is natural for us to desire to repay a kindness, but what do we do when the kindness is the greatest gift in the history of the world? Thankfully, the rest of the Mass will help us to know what to do!

For Reflection: Reflect on what may be blocking the door of your heart or obstructing the Lord Jesus' entrance. Make it a point to receive the Sacrament of Penance to prepare yourself to welcome Jesus more freely and fully in Holy Communion..

As it happened, I had been going through a dry spell in my faith, seeing Catholicism as just a set of things to believe, without any bearing on the real struggles and questions that are so prevalent today, especially, "Where does my dignity come from, and can it ever be taken away?"

Turning to the Gospels for comfort, I read with a new intention. I wanted to get to know Christ as a human person, not just as a God whose commands had to be rightly followed. Surprisingly, something clicked. When Christ spoke the words of institution at the Last Supper, he kept referring to the word "this." "This is my body; this is my blood." It was in that moment of re-reading those words, that I had heard so often at Mass, that the words finally went from my head to my heart.

Here he was, Jesus, the great man both fully human and fully divine. He was inviting me to get out of my head, stop treating my faith as just an intellectual exercise, and connect on a heart level. That weekend at Mass, I experienced the Eucharist in a whole new light.

It was one thing to constantly be told that I truly was receiving Jesus's body and blood, but it was another thing entirely to accept that in my heart. Here I was, a sinner just like everyone else, grateful to receive Jesus not just as a great teacher, but as the God-man who lived, died, and rose, for me. I could taste the one who poured out every drop of blood he had for me. I became his tabernacle, and his Presence filled every part of me.

South Carolina's governor issued an executive order to disqualify abortion facilities from receiving taxpayer funds through Medicaid. Planned Parenthood and an individual plaintiff quickly sued in federal court, challenging the state's decision. Both the district court and the Fourth Circuit ruled against South Carolina. The state appealed to the U.S. Supreme Court and the Court agreed to hear the case (Medina v. Planned Parenthood South Atlantic). This case could determine whether pro-life states can redirect taxpayer funds away from abortion providers like Planned Parenthood. reminder: Planned Parenthood is the largest provider of abortions in our country, kills more 370,000 preborn babies, and receives approximately \$700 Million dollars of our tax money each year. "A victory here could set a crucial precedent for other states, essentially signaling an end to Planned Parenthood's reign over the blood thirsty abortion industry". (Jordan Sekulow, Exec. 
