### Father Chuck's Corner

Greetings and God's blessings be yours on the Twenty-seventh Sunday in Ordinary Time! Today's readings invite us to contemplate the mystery and the gift of the sacrament of marriage and its importance for the world. In the first reading from Genesis, we read about how God created man and woman and how they were to be intimately related to each other. "That is why a man leaves his father and mother and clings to his wife, and the two of them become one flesh." Today's Psalm speaks about how God's blessings come to families when they stay in right relationship with him. "May the Lord bless us all the days of our lives." And finally, Mark's gospel shows Jesus dealing with the Pharisees about the question of divorce. He wanted his listeners, both the Pharisees and his apostles to understand the sacredness of marriage. It was not something to be easily done away with. "Therefore, what God has joined together, no human being must separate."

God made us for relationship with him and one another, and he calls us to a unity that is described as nothing less than "one flesh." Jesus emphasized what marriage is in today's gospel. Marriage is something God has done and does. We often think of marriage as something a couple does. They "get *married*" which in the sacrament is true that each is the minister of the sacrament to each other. But the relationship within matrimony is "what God has joined together." Every sacrament is God's work made tangible, known to our senses. A couple takes part in God's work, consents to it and makes it tangible to each other in speaking their vows. But it is God's gift. God is always faithful in every sacrament. He pours out his grace, acting as he promised. But we do know the heartbreaking reality of which Jesus speaks. Divorce, brokenness and separation are still possible and all too present. The challenge is deep but also contains good news. God has united a couple as one flesh and he wants to give every married person the love needed to live this commitment. But today's message is not only for married couples. To love rightly and justly is to imitate the love of God who created us and who is united with us through Jesus. This love is meant to be the foundation of every human relationship. To me the best way to love those God has placed in our lives is through the grace of the sacraments. Never underestimate their power, for that's where your childlike trust comes in.

Today, October 6th is our semi-annual Parish Blood Drive from 8am till 2pm in the school cafeteria. There is a critical need for blood, so if you are able, please consider giving this great gift of life. Walk-ins are most welcome. Check the bulletin for more details.

Today is Respect Life Sunday and once again our Human Life Committee is sponsoring the Baby Bottle Campaign to benefit the Life Center of Long Island. As you leave Mass, please take a baby bottle and fill it up over the next month. Then, return your bottle the weekend of November 2-3 with your generous donation. It will be a life saver for so many facing the challenge of an unplanned pregnancy.

Next Sunday, October 13th we will be having a special Food Collection at all the Masses to help replenish the food pantry for Parish Social Ministry. The needs have increased, and we urgently need help in meeting them for those who come for help. Please consider donating some food at Mass next weekend. Food bins will be at the doors of the church and on the pew shelves by the front doors. Please donate what is asked for by Parish Social Ministry. A listing of what is most needed is found in the bulletin. Thanks for helping.

Please remember to take home a copy of the bulletin when you leave Mass today. It contains many items of interest and information with something for everyone. The Great Amen

Amen! Today we look at our response at the end of the doxology: the Great Amen. After the priest sings or says, "Through him, and with him, and in him, O God, almighty Father, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all glory and honor is yours, for ever and ever," the people respond with, "Amen!" What exactly does Amen mean? Amen is a special word that most often is understood to mean, "So be it."

### What Does the Word "Amen" Mean?

Amen! Today we look at our response at the end of the doxology: the Great Amen. After the priest sings or says, "Through him, and with him, and in him, O God, almighty Father, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all glory and honor is yours, for ever and ever," the people respond with, "Amen!" What exactly does Amen mean? Amen is a special word that most often is understood to mean, "So be it."

### What is the "Great Amen" in the Mass?



Ok, so why is the "Amen" of this part of the Mass called the "Great Amen"? Fr. Oury teaches, "The Amen of the people has special importance at this moment of the celebration. It is more than ever a response and assent. Concerning it Bossuet wrote: 'In the Book of Revelation the elect are represented to us as ever singing Amen to God. Amen in sacred parlance is Yes, a firm and definite Yes that conquers assent, or rather, the whole heart. That is how they love in heaven. Ought we not do so on earth?'" (The Mass, p. 103). Similarly, the author of Understanding the Mass, Charles Belmonte instructs, "This is the most important Amen in the Mass. It is for us both a resolution and a prayer. A resolution upon which our love for God blooms; a prayer based on the future hope of resurrection" (p. 163). How Should We Say the "Great Amen"? If we think about our journey through the Mass, it makes sense to say this Amen is the most important. Take a moment to think about what has recently happened in the Mass: bread and wine were brought forward, along with all our prayers and sacrifices offered in union with Jesus. Through the words and actions of Jesus, the priest prayed the Eucharistic Prayer, and the bread and wine have been changed into the very Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity on the altar: Jesus himself is truly present with us! This is Almighty God with us! This is Jesus who loved us so perfectly that he gave everything for us! This is the moment of Jesus being offered to the Father in perfect praise, and we have been invited to join with Jesus!



Hopefully, we are so excited about what has just taken place that we want to belt out our Amen with great joy and fervor! With this mentality of joy and celebration, Belmonte quotes St. Jerome: "Let us sing or say the Great Amen with all our hearts united to all our brothers. Let it resound the whole world over, as the Amen of our early brothers in the faith 'resounded in heaven, as a celestial thunderclap in the Roman basilicas''' (Understanding the Mass, p. 163). Wouldn't that kind of "Amen" get the attention of our neighbors? "What was that loud sound that shook the ground? Oh, it was the Catholics at Mass singing Amen!"

### For Reflection:

 The Book of Revelation uses "Amen" as another name for Jesus: "The Amen, the faithful and true witness, the source of God's creation..." (Rev. 3:14). The angels, elders, and four living creatures use this word at both the beginning and end of prayer (see Rev. 7:12; cf. Rev. 19:4). In your own prayer, spend time with this word and allow its meaning to penetrate your life.

Now that we have introduced the Four Pillars of Mission, we now offer some ideas how to apply them to your life.

#### PILLAR 2 – EUCHARISTIC IDENTITY

Practical Suggestions for Practicing the Corporal and Spiritual Works of Mercy

The Corporal Works of Mercy are kind acts by which we help our neighbors with their everyday spiritual and emotional needs. Visiting the sick not only helps and supports the sick and the elderly but also fosters community and compassion.

#### Visiting the Sick:

- Eucharistic Minister: Consider becoming a Eucharistic Minister who brings Christ to the sick.
- Praying Together: Offering to pray with or for people who are ill, providing spiritual support.
- Hospital Visits: Spending time with someone in the hospital, bringing them comfort and companionship.
- Home Visits: Checking in on a friend or neighbor who is homebound or recovering from an illness.
- Providing Meals: Cooking or delivering meals to someone who is sick, ensuring they have nourishment during their recovery.
- Running Errands: Helping with grocery shopping or other errands for those unable to leave their homes due to illness.
- Offering Transportation: Driving someone to medical appointments or treatments.
- Listening: Taking the time to listen to their concerns and fears, providing emotional support.
- Sending Cards, Notes, Emails or Texts: Writing uplifting messages to let them know they are cared for and thought of.
- Engaging in Activities: Bringing books, games, or activities to help distract and entertain them during their illness.

### The Corporal Works of Mercy in Real Life

Organizations that offer opportunities to live out the Corporal Work of Mercy of visiting the sick:

The American Cancer Society: Offers a "Road to Recovery" program that sometimes includes meal delivery for patients undergoing treatment, partnering with local organizations for logistics.



The Society of St. Vincent de Paul: Local chapters throughout the Diocese organize visits to the sick, offering help and companionship to those in need.

*Red Cross Volunteer Transportation:* Many local Red Cross chapters provide transportation for seniors and individuals with disabilities to medical appointments.

*Prayer Shawl Ministries:* Found in various parishes, these groups not only knit shawls but also visit the sick to deliver them and provide support and prayer.

The Birthday Party Project: While focused on birthday celebrations for homeless children, they often include uplifting cards and messages in their packages for children in hospitals.

*Heart of the Father Ministries*: This Catholic organization sends letters and notes of encouragement to the sick and elderly, often including prayers and scripture.

*Catholic War Veterans:* This organization has local posts that work to support veterans, including those who are sick, through visits and care coordination.

A Christian who is living the mission of a disciple is one who believes in Jesus, who knows Jesus, who can't live without Jesus, and who wants to share with others the love, peace, and joy that he has experienced as a result of living in relationship with Jesus.



- · Male advocates available to speak with fathers


