

Father Chuck's Corner

Greetings and God's blessings be yours on the Seventh Sunday in Ordinary Time! The focus of today's readings is to realize that by giving, more gifts will be given to us. In the first reading from the First Book of Samuel, we see David sparing "God's anointed" when he had the chance to kill King Saul. For years, Saul had plotted to kill David and here we see David showing mercy to an enemy, just like Jesus preaches in today's gospel. "Today, though the Lord delivered you into my grasp, I would not harm the Lord's anointed." Then in the second reading from First Corinthians, Paul connects the human with the spiritual. We bear the image of Adam and also of God. "Just as we have borne the image of the earthly one, we shall also bear the image if the heavenly one." And finally, in Luke's gospel we have Jesus giving very direct and challenging teachings on how we are to live out all our relationships. He covers everything and everyone from family to enemies and touches on many possible interactions. None of them are very easy. This is where Jesus tells us that we should all be givers of gifts to others. The result is pretty clear. "For the measure with which you measure will in return be measured out to vou."

To me the real challenging statement of Jesus is when he says: "For if you love those who love you, what credit is that to you?" We can usually love those who are close to us like our spouse, children and friends. We do so because they are good to us. There was nothing vague or mysterious in what Jesus is saying to his disciples in this passage. What Jesus said was very concrete and specific, and probably the opposite of how nearly everyone had behaved since the dawn of time. Jesus is saying that if we truly want to be a disciple we have to find a way to love absolutely everyone! Now, we've heard this before, and we know how hard all this is. We can all trick ourselves into believing we are actually good at it. We would never try to find a way to do wrong to others. Maybe we neglect others and think we are teaching them one of life's tough lessons. Maybe we don't help people in other countries by feeling that a prosperous United States benefits everyone. Do we really believe God loves us more? Forgiving others who hurt us? Not so easy. Hurting back and retribution is the acceptable way of the world.

Yes, it is easy to love those who love us, care for us of benefit us in some way. But all others, that's a whole different story. Yet Jesus tells us that it's the same story, imperfect people helping and understanding and loving other imperfect people because God loves every one of us the same. He loves unconditionally, relentlessly and tenderly. So instead of finding excuses, find that person you have been withholding love from and start loving them today. God will be cheering you one.

We continue our parish's observance of the Eucharistic Revival with a special *Holy Hour* this Tuesday, February 25th from 7-8pm in the church. There will be Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament, music, a reflection and Benediction. Come and spend this time together with Jesus as we prepare for the start of Lent.

Please remember to take home a copy of the bulletin when you leave Mass today. It contains many items of interest and invitation, with something for everyone. Of special note is news and needs from Parish Social Ministry (especially a call for food pantry volunteers), info from Religious Education (Faith Formation), an invitation to the upcoming St. Patrick's Celebration on Saturday March 22nd, sponsored by the Knights of *Columbus*, the *Holy Hour* invitation for Tuesday evening, February 25th, application information about the Sodality of Our Lady 2025 Scholarship Exam, the Eucharistic Revival Centerfold, the Communal Prayer Before Mass (found on the inside back cover), an invitation to join FORMED (your Catholic Faith on demand) and much more. To keep informed, keep a copy of the bulletin at home each week for quick and easy reference.

Have a great week. Smile, share, try to "Love as I have loved you." And remember: When you feel like quitting, remember why you started.

1 Samuel 26:2, 7-9, 12-13, 22-23

In those days, Saul went down to the desert of Ziph with three thousand picked men of Israel, to search for David in the desert of Ziph. 

Holy Communion Part 1

As we continue through the Communion Rite, the long-anticipated moment has arrived. Finally, it is time for Holy Communion! This is the moment we have been preparing for throughout the whole Mass. Whenever I think about the joy of Holy Communion, I remember very vividly the thrill of my First Communion. I think of the song we all learned and the wonderful party afterward. But I especially remember the moment of Communion. Although I was small at the time, in second grade, I remember feeling a special closeness to God that I never had felt before. I don't know if I grasped what Holy Communion meant on an intellectual or even theological level, but I certainly felt a true spiritual union with our Lord.



As Fr. Joseph McGloin, author of "How to Get More Out of the Mass," teaches, "The word 'communion' is almost self-explanatory. Literally, it means 'union with.' It suggests a sharing, a mutual participation. Holy Communion, is, then, an intimate sharing in the life of Christ" (,p. 128).

That is exactly what takes place in Holy Communion. We receive the Precious Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity of Christ into our bodies, and he unites us with himself. Unlike regular food which becomes part of our bodies,

the Eucharist unites our bodies to the Lord. Fr. McGloin continues, "While the other sacraments bring us the grace of Christ, this one brings us the grace of Christ himself along with himself. Truly, a person with any faith in Christ would be foolish to neglect this great gift" (How to Get More Out of the Mass, p. 133).

Participating in Christ's Perfect Sacrifice



Did you notice he said sacrifice? Hopefully, this word reminds us of one of the names for the Mass—the Holy Sacrifice. As we have journeyed through the Mass, we have noted that the Mass is a true sharing in the Last Supper and in the Cross of Jesus. In the Mass, we are invited to participate in the one perfect sacrifice of Jesus. Fr. Guy Oury, author of "The Mass," tells us how sacrifice and Holy Communion fit together in the Mass. He says, "The Mass is a sacrifice but also a repast, or rather, a sacrificial repast. It would not have meaning, at least not the meaning given it by the Lord, were it not also Communion." He goes on to say, "The meal symbolizes the union between the God of the covenant and the people of God."

For Reflection: Reflect on God's promise through Isaiah to provide a feast "for all peoples" (see Isa 25:1–9). Thank Christ for his sacrifice present in the Mass, and make Isaiah's prayer your own: "let us rejoice and be glad that he has saved us!" (Isa 25:9).

Thoughts After Communion - Humble Confidence Father Jean du Cœur de Jésus d'Elbée

Jesus needs nothing but your humility and your confidence to work marvels of purification and sanctification in you. And your confidence will be in proportion to your humility, because it is to the extent that we realize our need of Jesus that we have recourse to him, and we sense this need to the extent that we justly realize our unworthiness. Think of the woman who asks Jesus to cure her daughter. She asks no more than a crumb at the banquet of merciful love! Jesus is conquered.

Go to Jesus recognizing that you merit nothing, but expecting everything from a completely gratuitous and infinite mercy. Recall the centurion: "Lord, I am not worthy, but speak only a word and my servant shall be healed." In the manner of the centurion, you also must say, "I am not worthy to receive you; I merit nothing; I am an abyss of weakness and cowardice; I make resolutions and do not keep them; I fall over and over again. But Jesus, say only one word, and my soul shall be healed." Jesus was so delighted by the centurion's words that he willed them to be fixed in the liturgy of the Mass, to be forever the most perfect preparation for Communion. I can imagine the centurion in heaven, enjoying the unspeakable glory and beatitude of hearing these words, which came from his heart, repeated at the moment when Jesus is received in the Host by all priests and all communicants, in all the Masses that are celebrated in the entire world until the end of time.

When Jesus tests your faith, give him, like the Canaanite woman and the centurion, these responses that eternal wisdom inspires in little ones, and he will shower his graces upon you.



Pantry items still needed: Pasta Sauce, Mac and Cheese, Mashed Potatoes, Baked Beans, Canned Carrots, Canned Fruit, Peanut Butter, Grape Jelly, Canned Meat, Tuna Fish, Jell-O and Snacks.

Food donations can be brought to the Ryan House during its open hours or non-perishable food can be left in the bin on the Ryan House porch or in the Altar Server's Sacristy.

St. Raymond's Parish Social Ministry is in need of volunteers to help stock shelves, pack groceries, make appointments, greet clients, and assist with food pickup.


The food pantry is currently open from Monday through Wednesday from 10am to 3pm.


