Father Chuck's Corner

Greetings and God's blessings be yours on the Twenty-ninth Sunday in Ordinary Time! The theme of this Sunday's readings is that the greatest "greatness" is found in humble service. In the first reading from the prophet Isaiah, the suffering servant theme is put forth. "If he gives his life as an offering for sin, he shall see his descendants in a long life, and the will of the Lord shall be accomplished through him." Then in the second reading from Hebrews, we are encouraged to seek Jesus when we are faced with our inadequacies in meeting the challenges of life. "So let us confidently approach the throne of grace to receive mercy and to find grace for timely help." And finally, Mark's gospel describes how James and John were seeking places of honor in heaven. The other 10 apostles were angry at their boldness but Jesus cuts through all their bickering by telling them what is required to find any honor in heaven. "Rather, whoever wishes to be great among you will be your servant; whoever wishes to be first among you will be the slave of all. For the Son of Man did not come to be served, but to serve and to give his life as a ransom for many."

If you have ever hurt someone in a serious way, you know that it's a pretty bad feeling. And especially hard if it is someone you really care about, truly respect and love. While you can't undo what you have done the only recourse is to ask for forgiveness. That's not easy either. You have to revisit something painful and say the right things. And if you do it right, you are hoping for one outcome. You are hoping the person you have wronged will understand your faults and failings. That's the only way true healing can begin. This is a big part of our relationship with God. We are told in today's reading from Hebrews that our God doesn't understand us from afar, from without. Through the Incarnation, he actually understands us from within, from walking the same journey with us. Our God truly understands us, all the good stuff and especially the stuff we are not proud of. He understands our faults, failures and weak wills, yes, even our sins. This means God doesn't have unrealistic expectations for us. He hopes for the best, desires the best, knows what we are capable of, yet also knows our circumstance with mixed motives. The fallen world is well known by God, which should be a great comfort to us.

We have a God who accepts our apologies in the deepest, most sincere way. His response is to say, "I love you, and I'm okay with you're not being perfect." That's our God. But can we be that person for others? It takes true humility to live this way in our day-to-day lives. It takes humility to admit we are not the person we hope to be, to admit our weaknesses and sins as a reason for forgiving the same things in others. May we, in deep and authentic humility open our hearts to see others the way God sees us. That's how we may begin to build a kinder, more compassionate and forgiving world.

In keeping the spirit of the Eucharistic Revival, there will be a special *Holy Hour* this Tuesday evening, October 22nd from 7-8pm in the church. There will be Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament, Prayer, Reflection, Music and Benediction. All are invited to spend this time with Jesus. And bring a friend.

The Lord's Prayer

As we journey through our final preparations before Communion, we take a closer look at the Our

Father. "At our Savior's command and formed by divine teaching, we dare to say: Our Father..." The Lord's Prayer is the first part of the Communion Rite. This prayer, of course, is the prayer given to us by Jesus in the Gospel (Matthew 6:9-13; Luke 11:2-4). These are the very words that Jesus gave us to pray! As a priest, I feel like one of the most common things people say to me is that they don't feel like they pray very well, or that they don't know what to say when they pray. Maybe the disciples felt this way when they asked Jesus how to pray. In response, he gave the words that we now know as the Our Father. Here is an opportunity to pray with confidence with words directly from the mouth of Jesus.

A Daring Prayer

Why does the priest say in the invitation, "we dare to say"? As Charles Belmonte, the author of Understanding the Mass, notes, "This invitation is a very touching and most ancient formula (one alluded to as early as the fourth century by St. Jerome). It states that we should not dare (audemus) to utter what we are about to say-were it not for the express command of our Lord. He taught us to approach God as a son talks to his father" (p. 169). According to the Diocese of Peoria, "Our Lord used the word 'Abba' to express our filiation of the most high God. We are His sons and daughters and we call upon Him in a most intimate and familial term: Father. Our Lord desires we approach our Father with the serenity and confidence of children. Not only does he reveal this, but in a certain sense he commands it when he says, 'When you pray, pray like this... Our Father!" ("A Study of the Mass, p. 17). We dare to call God our Father because Jesus said we could! we receive his Body and Blood by eating and drinking. That is what the Communion Rite is all about: the point of all the prayers, gestures, and words is that we receive Jesus the Lord in Holy Communion!

If you look through the Old Testament, we see a few people having a uniquely close relationship with God: Adam, Abraham, and others who talked with God (Genesis 3 and 18); Moses, whose face was radiant after being in God's presence (Exodus 34); Jonah and Job who talked with God when angry and frustrated (Jonah 4; Job 3 and 42), among others. As Edward Sri, the author of A Biblical Walk Through the Mass, writes, "The ancient Jews certainly viewed God as the father of the people of Israel. But it was not at all common for an individual to address God as 'Father.' Nevertheless, this is precisely what Jesus calls us to do [...] and if he was speaking his native Aramaic, he probably used the word 'Abba' for father. This was an intimate, affectionate term similar to 'Daddy'... This underscores the intimate relationship we now have with God because of Jesus' work of salvation. Through our union in Christ, God has truly become our Father" (p. 124).

God's Desire to Be Close to Us

Among some of the first words we learn as young children are "mommy" and "daddy." This is true for all different kinds of people with all different kinds of language. In some ways, these words are really central to who we are ... people in



relation to others. When Jesus taught us to pray, he said we should begin by saying, "Our Father." If a good translation of "Abba" is "Daddy," just think about how close God wants us to be! So close, in fact, that we could call him by a name that even a young child could recognize. What an amazing gift! What an amazing sharing in the life of God! No wonder we can pray with confidence-we have a Loving Father who loves us so much and so perfectly! As the Diocese of Peoria has said, "The 'Our Father' itself is a model of prayer. It beseeches the Father, it praises and blesses Him, it recognizes His Divinity and Majesty. It asks and intercedes, asks pardon for our sins, avoidance of temptation and a deliverance from evil. It is so fitting we call upon our Father God in such a great prayer as we prepare to receive His great gifts... In this proximate preparation for Holy Communion, we are asking the Father for the gift of His Son. Unworthy as we are, we pray this in confidence, knowing of His infinite mercy and desire to share His gifts with us" ("A Study of the Mass, p. 17).

For Reflection: Give thanks to God for the men who have been models of loving fatherhood in your own life.

Now that we have introduced the Four Pillars of Mission, we now offer some ideas how to apply them to your life.

PILLAR 2 – EUCHARISTIC IDENTITY

Practical Suggestions for Practicing the Corporal and Spiritual Works of Mercy

The Spiritual Works of Mercy are kind acts by which we help our neighbors with their everyday spiritual and emotional needs. Admonishing sinners is a sensitive and compassionate task that involves a blend of compassion, guidance, and faith.

To Admonish Sinners:

- Pray for Sinners: Regularly include those struggling with sin in your prayers, asking for their conversion and healing.
- Be a Compassionate Listener: Create a safe space for someone to discuss their struggles without judgment, allowing them to articulate their feelings.
- Model Forgiveness: Demonstrate forgiveness in your own life, showing how to move past wrongdoing and embrace grace.
- Participate in Confession: Encourage others to experience the sacrament of reconciliation and share its positive impact on your life.
- Offer Guidance from Church Teachings: Share teachings from the Catechism or from Church leaders that provide clarity on moral issues.
- Speak Up: Don't keep silent when there is an attack on the Catholic Faith in the media. Write an email or a letter to the editor or to the news outlet to correct misunderstandings or misinformation about the Catholic Faith. Respond to negativity and prejudice with positive statements.
- Lead by Example: Live a life that reflects Catholic values, inspiring others through your actions and integrity.

The Office of Faith Formation (Diocese of Rockville Centre): Provides resources and programs aimed at spiritual growth and the Sacrament of Reconciliation.






