Father Chuck's Corner

Greetings and God's Holy Advent blessings be yours on the Second Sunday of Advent! We start this second week by paying attention to the call for repentance and harmony in our lives. We are challenged to be people of peace, unity, and contrition in service to Jesus our Savior and King. In the first reading from the prophet Isaiah, God wants the people to open their minds to understand their purpose as God's chosen ones. "There shall be no harm or ruin on all my holy mountain; for the earth shall be filled with knowledge of the Lord, as water covers the sea." Then in the second reading to the Romans, Paul urges his readers to strive for the kind of harmony and unity that comes from the Scriptures' message. All believers are to be welcome from other nations. "Welcome one another, then, as Christ welcomed you, for the glory of God." And finally, Matthew's gospel prepares us for the ministry of Jesus by focusing on John the Baptist, whose preaching sets the stage for Jesus. The preparation John talks about is repentance in view of the kingdom of heaven. This repentance of John meant a radical change was affected. "I am baptizing you with water for repentance, but the one who is coming after me is mightier that I. I am not worthy to carry his sandals. He will baptize you with the Holy Spirit and fire."

You may be familiar with the former actress, Dolores Hart. She was a budding film star of the late fifties and early sixties, working with many top stars of that time. She became engaged to marry a man named Don Robinson at that time too. Then she met Pope St. John XXIII in Rome while playing the role of St. Clare in the Movie, Francis of Assisi. The pope declared that "you are Clare," a statement that stayed with Dolores. In 1963 she shocked Hollywood by breaking off her engagement and entering an order of Monastic nuns in Connecticut where she is now known as Mother Dolores Hart. Needless to say, the reaction of family and friends was not very kind and understanding.

Years later, Sister Dolores wrote in her memoirs, "If you heard what I hear, you would come too." Sister Dolores found lasting peace in being faithful to God, because despite her blossoming film career and engagement to a wonderful man, her heart would not be truly fulfilled.

She experienced and followed a call to radical change, even though it meant giving up the excitement of being a celebrity. Her efforts were rewarded with lasting peace. Maybe not so dramatically, but we too need to consider the radical change we must undergo to have complete fidelity to God. And to find out what, listen to the "voice in the wilderness" that will show you the way as the people who followed John the Baptist did and Mother Dolores Hart did.

On behalf of everyone I would like to give a special thanks to *Anne Marie Behrman* who created and made the beautiful altar cloth for the Advent Season. The frontal piece really stands out with its Advent Wreath candles and the individual messages for the four weeks of Advent. Thank you, Anne Marie, for sharing your time, talent and treasure in such a beautiful way with St. Raymond Parish.

In the continued spirit of thanksgiving, let me also express gratitude to our *Parish Social Ministry*, which just last week helped over 50 families enjoy a traditional Thanksgiving Day dinner. And thanks to all the volunteers who helped and continue to help our Parish Social Ministry meet the needs of people in our community. Thanks also to all who made food donations and contributions that helps tremendously in our efforts to help others. It is when you are involved in these efforts, and for Christmas and the Giving Tree, that you truly show the face of Christ.

Remember to take home a copy of the bulletin when you leave Mass today. It contains many items of interest and invitation, with something for everyone. Of special note is news and needs from Parish Social Ministry, info from Religious Education, the Mass Schedule for the December 8th Immaculate Conception Holyday, the Countdown to Christmas order form (still plenty of winners to come), the Countdown Calendar with current winning numbers posted, an order form for the Special Memorial Candles, a request for Parishioner Emails, an invitation to join FORMED (your Catholic Faith on demand and much more. Have a great Second Week of Advent. **Bring** peace to others wherever you go and remember: Instead of pointing a finger, lend a hand.





You are at least 70 1/2 years old on the date you make your gift

QCDs are not included in your adjusted gross income.

QCDs deliver a tax benefit while "regular" charitable donations might not since the Tax Cuts and Jobs Act almost doubled the standard deductions amounts.

QCDs taken from your traditional IRA counts as a distribution for the required minimum distribution (RMD) rules. Therefore, you can donate all or part of your RMD that you would otherwise be forced to receive and pay taxes on.

The best way for you to start is with your IRA custodian. Tell them you want to make a "qualified charitable distribution." In most cases you will only have to fill out a simple form.

VERY IMPORTANT!! Your gift <u>must</u> go directly from your IRA to the Charity. If you receive the money first then you'll be taxed on it like any other distribution.

Chuck has \$125,000 in a traditional IRA and would like to contribute \$5,000 to St. Raymond Parish. Upon hearing of the **Charitable IRA Rollover** opportunity, he directs the custodian of his IRA to transfer this amount not later than December 31, 2022 directly to St. Raymond Parish as the family's 2022 gift.
