Father Chuck's Corner

Greetings and God's blessings be yours on the Twentieth Sunday in Ordinary Time! Once again Jesus is emphasizing that his flesh is true food, and his blood is true drink. In the first reading from Proverbs, we see God encouraging his people to eat his food and drink his wine. It is a foretaste of how Jesus will personalize bread and wine as his body and blood, which will give life. "Forsake foolishness that you may live, advance in the way of understanding." Then in the second reading from the Letter to the Ephesians, Paul encourages the people to be wise, filled with the Holy Spirit so that they will understand the will of God. "Watch carefully how you live, not as foolish persons but as wise, making the most of the opportunity, because the days are evil." And finally in Mark's gospel we continue to hear more of the "Bread of Life Discourse." Here Jesus identifies the living bread with his flesh, which he gives for the life of the world. His Jewish listeners wonder how he can give them his flesh to eat, so Jesus asserts his identity and the importance of eating this bread. "I am the living bread that came down from heaven; whoever eats this bread will live forever; and the bread that I will give is my flesh for the life of the world."

Jesus keeps on saying odd things in his "Bread of *Life Discourse*" that certainly seemed strange to the crowds that heard him speak. But for us Catholics, as we hear Jesus' words, our thoughts go immediately to the Eucharist, the sacred meal we share every week. His words to eat the flesh of the Son of Man and "my flesh is true food," don't completely throw us off. We have a context to put them in as a concrete expression of a deep truth. "Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood remains in me and I in him." These are beautiful words spoken by Jesus. It's an incredible image that sounds like something each of us would want to embrace. To me this sentence is both an invitation and a promise. The invitation is what we accept each week when we come for Mass. We come to be with God, listen to his words, pray and dwell in adoration. Most of all we come to eat, to receive Jesus in the Eucharist. This is how we accept God's invitation. Then comes the second part, the promise. After accepting God's invitation to join him, we promise to invite him into our lives, so he can make a difference in how we live. He wants to be a part of our joys and sorrows, our successes and failures

He wants us to host him wherever we're in our lives, into whatever is going on. That's why we don't stay in church after receiving the Eucharist. We consume his Body and Blood and then take him with us from church, willing to share his love and compassion and mercy with everyone we meet. God is our host in church, and we are his host in our bodies and out in the world. Embrace the invitation while at Mass and then the promise by inviting Jesus into every corner of your life as you go: *To love and serve the Lord.*"

Transubstantiation

I often hear people ask why it is that, for so many priests, the Consecration is their favorite moment of the Mass. How exactly does the Consecration "work?" Thanks for asking!

At the moment of the Consecration and the elevation that follows, I am always reassured that I am exactly where I am supposed to be: I am answering the call God gave to me to serve as a priest. As we all are, I am a work in progress, and some days feel like much more progress is needed. However, in that moment of the Mass, I am always comforted and strengthened, humbled and invigorated. Because I can be a perfectionist, I don't always receive compliments well; because I have a quick mind, I'm often thinking of problems to solve and things that need to be done. But in that moment of the Mass is true rest and peace. If you are like me and often have a preoccupied mind, I invite you in that special moment of the Mass to enjoy resting in his peace. Remind yourself that there is no better place to be in that moment than united with Jesus truly present on the altar.

How the Consecration Effects Transubstantiation

How exactly does the Consecration work? Let's turn to our Catechism for some helpful wisdom. "It is by the conversion of the bread and wine into Christ's body and blood that Christ becomes present in this sacrament. The Church Fathers strongly affirmed the faith of the Church in the efficacy of the Word of Christ and of the action of the Holy Spirit to bring about this conversion. Thus St. John Chrysostom declares: 'It is not man that causes the things offered to become the Body and Blood of Christ, but he who was crucified for us, Christ himself. The priest, in the role of Christ, pronounces these words, but their power and grace are God's. This is my body, he says. This word transforms the things offered" (CCC, 1375). The Catechism tells us that the word of Jesus is what changes the bread and wine into his Body and Blood. The Catechism continues, "The Council of Trent summarizes the Catholic faith by declaring:

'Because Christ our Redeemer said that it was truly his body that he was offering under the species of bread, it has always been the conviction of the Church of God, and this holy Council now declares again, that by the consecration of the bread and wine there takes place a change of the whole substance of the bread into the substance of the body of Christ our Lord and the whole substance of the wine into the substance of his blood. This change the holy Catholic Church has fittingly and properly called transubstantiation" (CCC, 1376). For many of us, transubstantiation can be a big and intimidating word. The reason we use words like these is that they help us describe with precision what we believe is true. Transubstantiation helps us know that the "what it is" is what changes during the Mass. As we said before regarding the gifts, what they are before the consecration is simple bread and wine. Those words of Jesus change the bread and wine into his Body and Blood. Even though the appearances remain, we believe that the whole Christ is present in the consecrated host and chalice. As our Catechism teaches, the reason we believe that Jesus is present is because Jesus said it. We believe him when he says: "This is my Body." We believe him when he says "This is my Blood." We believe that the Eucharist really is Jesus. The same Jesus who was born in Bethlehem, the same Jesus who offered himself on the Cross-Jesus is truly with us!

Seeing with Eyes of Faith

"But Father, the host still 'looks' the same!" some may say. St. Cyril of Jerusalem (314–386) teaches, "Do not think these are just plain bread and plain wine. They are the body and blood of Christ, as the Lord asserted. Faith must convince you of the latter even though your senses suggest to you the former. Do not judge about this according to your preferences but, based on your faith, believe with firmness and certainty that you have been made worthy of the body and blood of Christ" If your faith feels unsure, ask the Lord to help you see with the eyes of faith that he is truly there. Let us shout with joy the words of St. John, "It is the Lord!" (John 21:7).

For Reflection: Consider checking out episodes 180–194 of Fr. Mike Schmitz's Catechism in a Year, which leads listeners on a journey into the mystery of the Eucharist.

Now that we have introduced the Four Pillars of Mission, we now offer some ideas how to apply them to your life.

PILLAR 1 – EUCHARISTIC ENCOUNTER

If God is love itself, then that love is experienced, lived and shared with others after we have each entered into a relationship with God — either for the first time or anytime we go deeper into that relationship. Think of it this way: Every time you do the following things, you are working on your personal relationship with Jesus (as long as you choose Him out of love and faith):

- · Set time apart daily to pray. This time shouldn't just be prayers that are done merely out of obligation. Our goal should be intimate union with God. As the saints tell us to do, we need to speak to him as we would a friend. When we are done talking, listening is even more important. This is personal prayer.
- · Actively receive the sacraments. I know that you can put off going to confession, but I have never regretted my time spent in going, once I committed to a monthly date with Jesus in the confessional. Building on this, we need to try to enter more deeply into Mass. There is no better place to work on our personal relationship with Jesus than when we receive him into our bodies and souls in the Eucharist. The depths of graces we can mine in the Eucharistic relationship have no end.
- Read and meditate with sacred Scripture. The Bible is written for each of us. The Church says that each time we study and pray with Scripture (if we do so in a spirit of prayer), we have the opportunity to once again encounter Jesus. We can learn more about Him, but the point is to ultimately love him more as well.

Perform acts of mercy and serve others selflessly. Everyone wants to be served, and God has put us on this earth to serve others. The good thing is, we get something out of it too. When we give ourselves away in loving service to others, we grow as disciples. We get back when we give to others. God is never outdone when we love Him and others.



Pillar 1 - Eucharistic Witness

"Modern man listens more willingly to witnesses than to teachers, and if he does listen to teachers, it is because they are witnesses." St. Paul VI

> St. Maximilian Kolbe Priest & Martyr (†1941)

St. Maximilian Kolbe is a man most often remembered for his heroic death at the hands of the Nazis, but even before this culminating moment he had long before laid down his life for God. As a Conventual Franciscan he founded an impressive friary that ended up being one of the largest of its time, which took up the task of publishing a newspaper called "The Knight," which became recognized as one of the greatest in his home of Poland, and soon around the world as far as Japan.

Reading the first-person accounts of people who knew and loved him, it is easy to see why he was so quick to offer his life for a stranger in a concentration camp. For he had already given himself completely over to the perfect will of God, taking up wholeheartedly the mission of the Apostles. Yet he approached it in a way that wasn't off-putting as many of we Christians tend to be.

People who knew him were attracted to him because "he radiated goodness." How many of our friends can say that about us? Yet it's true that those souls filled with God are people who reflect his light on the world. And we are attracted to that holiness—not necessarily the solemn, silent saint with his eyes always downcast, but the joyful, humble holiness as described here. This is the kind of person you just want to be around, the kind of person deep down that we all want to be. In fact, it's the kind of person that God has created us to be, that He challenges us to be.

Think of it less as telling people about Jesus, and more as showing people Jesus in yourself, in who you are and how you live. Your lived example will be more convincing, more inviting, more attractive, and in the end more challenging to others as you invite them through your actions to get to know God.

A Christian who is living the mission of a disciple is one who believes in Jesus, who knows Jesus, who can't live without Jesus, and who wants to share with others the love, peace, and joy that he has experienced as a result of living in relationship with Jesus.


