Father Chuck's Corner

Greetings and God's continued Advent blessings be yours on the Second Sunday of Advent. We have a God who is never static, always on the move and Advent gives us a yearly reminder of this truth. We give thanks for this profound movement of God right into our very lives. The first reading from Baruch tells of how much God will be acting on behalf of the Israelites. "The forest and every kind of tree have overshadowed Israel at God's command: for God is leading Israel in joy by the light of his glory, with his mercy and justice for company." Then in the second reading Paul encourages the Philippians to keep growing in their relationship with Jesus. "I am confident of this, that the one who began a good work in you will continue to complete it until the day of Christ Jesus." And finally, Luke's gospel asserts the prophetic role of John the Baptist. He will be the last prophet, telling the people to get ready for the Messiah by repentance: "Prepare the way of the Lord, make straight his paths.'

The birth of Jesus is the greatest manifestation of and the proof that God isn't off somewhere far away. He has visited creation in other ways too since the dawn of time. He made himself known to Noah, Abraham and Moses as well as to many prophets down through the centuries. And he even made himself known to two simple people, namely Mary and Joseph, whose cooperation would help steer creation on a new course. We should never just simply remain sort of frozen waiting for God to come to us. Our readings today tell us we have a role to play in God's plan. We are called in faith to seek God in all things, while also removing any obstacles that might make it hard for God to come to us in the complete way he wants. So, while we spend this holy season anticipating our God once again breaking into our world, breaking into our hearts; let's make sure that we are getting rid of whatever might be in the way, whatever might make our encounters with God less than they can be, and certainly less than what God wants them to be. This is what repentance is all about. Get rid of those valleys and mountains, and while our loving God pursues us, let's also rush out to meet him. It might just become the life-changing encounter we've been waiting for.



'Tis the season for giving and the Parish Social Ministry would like to express their sincere thanks to several other community organizations who have recently held food drives for the benefit of our food pantry. The Waverly Park Elementary School, the Rhame Avenue Elementary School K-KIDS and the Lynbrook Kindergarten Centre all donated substantial collections of food to our pantry. We are very grateful for these donations which will help keep our shelves stocked to assist our clients.

During the month of November, the Parish Social Ministry assisted 99 households with food, personal care and household items and provided them with other services they needed. Also, during the month of November, 1 new client was welcomed into our Outreach Program and the client received food assistance and information on organizations that could assist them with other services, such as DSS, Catholic Charities and St. Vincent de Paul.

Pantry items still needed: Cold Cereal, Mayonnaise, Sugar, Grape Jelly, Pancake Mix, Pancake Syrup, Pinto Beans, Bags of White Rice and Canned Meat.

Food donations can be brought to the Ryan House during its open hours or non-perishable food can be left in the bin on the Ryan House porch or in the Altar Server's Sacristy.

The Rite of Peace Part 2

Continuing from last week's bulletin, following the Our Father prayer and the Embolism, "There follows the Rite of Peace, by which the Church entreats peace and unity for herself and for the whole human family, and the faithful express to each other their ecclesial communion and mutual charity before communicating in the Sacrament." (The General Instruction for the Roman Missal, p. 82).

Peace As Preparation for Communion

Fr. Guy Oury, the author of The Mass, reflecting on the Rite of Peace in the Mass, says, "Through the sign of peace, we ask for peace and unity within the Church, and beyond its visible boundaries, for the whole human family. And since in our gatherings we are a cell of the Church, we express our mutual love before receiving together the one Bread that makes us one. These are the two components of the rite: a prayer for the peace and unity of the Church and an exchange of the sign of fraternal converse, if not with the whole world, at least with our nearest neighbors" (pp. 111-12). So, we aren't just making sure things are ok with people in our pew; we are also making a symbolic gesture of peace for the whole world! Next week, we'll take a look at some different ways to offer the Sign of Peace, and why this is not the time for "high fives" and making plans for later in the day!

Historical/liturgical note:
For those looking for more historical background on the placement of the Rite of Peace at this point in the Mass, as Fr. Guy Oury indicates, it was historically at various places in the Mass.



In his writings, St. Justin "places it immediately Universal after the Prayer (General Intercessions)... [S]uch also must have been the custom in Rome, from earliest times until about the fifth century. The Sermon on the Mount in St. Matthew says: 'If you bring your gift to the altar, and there recall that your brother has anything against you, leave your gift at the altar, go first and be reconciled with your brother, and then come and offer your gift' (Mt 5:23-24). Given these words of Christ, the offertory seemed the perfect moment for the sign of peace. But there was called for a gesture, a rite, a concrete expression. The Sign of Peace was clearly indicated, and transfer was made to its present place. Evidence suggests that this was done in the early fifth century" (The Mass, p. 111).

For Reflection: Peace is one of the fruits of the Holy Spirit which St. Paul lists in his Letter to the Galatians (5:22): "But the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness". The verse continues in Galatians 5:23, "gentleness, self-control; against such things there is no law." Implore the Holy Spirit for this fruit in your own life and the grace and guidance to share this gift with others.

Now that we have introduced the Four Pillars of Mission, we now offer ideas on how to apply them to your life.

PILLAR 2 - EUCHARISTIC IDENTITY

Practical Suggestions for Practicing the Corporal and Spiritual Works of Mercy

The Spiritual Work of Mercy of forgiving injuries calls us to demonstrate compassion, understanding, and forgiveness toward those who have wronged or hurt us. Here are suggestions for you to actively live out this mercy:

To Forgive Injuries:

- Pray for the person who hurt you: Say a prayer asking God to bless and heal the person who caused you harm, rather than harboring resentment. Ask God for the grace to forgive the person and help you heal from the injury.
- Seek reconciliation: When appropriate, make an effort to restore the relationship, either through dialogue or action, as a gesture of forgiveness.
- Avoid speaking ill of the person: Refrain from gossiping, slandering, or complaining about the person who has wronged you.
- Ask for forgiveness for your own sins: Recognize that your own need for God's mercy encourages you to extend mercy to others. If struggling with forgiveness, speak to a priest in confession about the difficulty in letting go of the offense.
- Attend Mass and pray for forgiveness: Participate in the Eucharist, seeking God's healing grace and asking for the strength to forgive.
- Perform an act of charity: Show forgiveness in a tangible way by offering help or support to the person who has wronged you.

Pillar 2 - Eucharistic Witness

"Modern man listens more willingly to witnesses than to teachers, and if he does listen to teachers, it is because they are witnesses." St. Paul VI

The Spiritual Works of Mercy in Real Life

These organizations offer various programs and services designed to help individuals forgive injuries and heal emotionally and spiritually. Many of them offer counseling, retreats, and workshops to support the Catholic community in living out this important Spiritual Work of Mercy.

Long Island Metro Retrouvaille: Provides a path for healing emotional wounds, including the ability to forgive past hurts. It emphasizes the importance of forgiveness as a critical element of the restoration process.

PRAYER FOR THE GRACE TO FORGIVE
