#### Father Chuck's Corner

Greetings and God's blessings be yours on the Feast of the Presentation of the Lord which falls on the Fourth Sunday in Ordinary Time! Today's readings are about encountering Jesus who brings us salvation. The first reading from Malachi speaks of how the people were being prepared by John the Baptist for the coming savior. "Lo, I am sending my messenger to prepare the way before my, and suddenly there will come to the temple the Lord whom you seek..." Then in the second reading from the Letter to the Hebrews, the people are told how Jesus in becoming one of us submits to suffering in order to bring glory to all people and to his Father. "Because he himself was tested through what he suffered, he is able to help those who are being tested." And finally, Luke's gospel describes the scene of the Presentation of Jesus in the temple. Mary and Joseph were fulfilling their purification according to the law of Moses which said: "Every male that open the womb shall be consecrated to the Lord, and to offer the sacrifice of a pair of turtledoves or two young pigeons, in accordance with the dictate in the law of the Lord." Jesus was recognized by Simeon and Anna who were in the temple at that time. They affirmed that Jesus would fulfill all the prophecies of old.

By the prompting of the Holy Spirit, Simeon knows immediately that the child is the Messiah for whom he has long waited. He felt the joy of keeping watch all these years. He feels his duty is now completed. And since he has now seen his salvation in person, he can peacefully leave this life. Anna too recognized Jesus in her presence and she too gave thanks to God and spoke about the child with great joy since she was seeing God's promise being fulfilled. How can we imitate Simeon and Anna, so as to recognize God's action in our lives? How can we learn to respond with the same joy, adoration and gratitude? Like Simeon and Anna, a good deal of our lives is spent in the silence of waiting. But like them we too need to be steadfast while praying, fasting and hoping that if we are faithful, we will learn to recognize Jesus when he comes. By bringing Jesus for presentation in the temple, Mary and Joseph brough the perfect, spotless Lamb of God who takes away all the sins of the world. Jesus is likewise present to us today in Holy Communion. Happy are we, like Simeon and Anna if we too prepare our hearts to encounter Jesus, our salvation.

Because he himself was tested through what he suffered, he is able to help those who are being tested.

When the days were completed for their purification according to the law of Moses, Mary and Joseph took Jesus up to Jerusalem to present him to the Lord, just as it is written in the law of the Lord, Every male that opens the womb shall be consecrated to the Lord, and to offer the sacrifice of a pair of turtledoves or two young pigeons, in accordance with the dictate in the law of the Lord. Now there was a man in Jerusalem whose name was Simeon. This man was righteous and devout, awaiting the consolation of Israel, and the Holv Spirit was upon him. It had been revealed to him by the Holy Spirit that he should not see death before he had seen the Christ of the Lord. He came in the Spirit into the temple; and when the parents brought in the child Jesus to perform the custom of the law in regard to him, he took him into his arms and blessed God, saying: "Now, Master, you may let your servant go in peace, according to your word, for my eyes have seen your salvation, which you prepared in the sight of all the peoples: a light for revelation to the Gentiles, and glory for your people Israel." The child's father and mother were amazed at what was said about him: and Simeon blessed them and said to Mary his mother, "Behold, this child is destined for the fall and rise of many in Israel, and to be a sign that will be contradicted-and you yourself a sword will pierce-so that the thoughts of many hearts may be revealed." There was also a prophetess, Anna, the daughter of Phanuel, of the tribe of Asher. She was advanced in years, having lived seven years with her husband after her marriage, and then as a widow until she was eighty-four. She never left the temple, but worshiped night and day with fasting and prayer. And coming forward at that very time, she gave thanks to God and spoke about the child to all who were awaiting the redemption of Jerusalem. When they had fulfilled all the prescriptions of the law of the Lord, they returned to Galilee, to their own town of Nazareth. The child grew and became strong, filled with wisdom; and the favor of God was upon him.



During the month of December, the Parish Social Ministry assisted 78 households with food, personal care and household items and provided them with other services they needed. The Born-Alive Abortion Survivors
Protection Act

(House #H.R.21, Senate #S.6)

This Act, if passed, would require health care providers to give babies, born alive after an attempted abortion, the same medical care that they would for any baby born at the same gestational age, and to transport them to a hospital. Currently, denying these infants care and leaving them alone to die - unlike a direct act of killing - is not often adequately covered by state laws, leaving a critical gap in needed protection. Some may think after reading this, that if the baby survives an abortion and is alive and breathing, the doctor would surely give the appropriate medical care to the baby. However, for many years, the abortion industry has kept this secret from the public. At times, babies have, and still do, survive the abortion. They are known in the abortion business as "the dreaded complication". And even though they survived the abortion, through neglect or other actions, they will die. This week the House of Representatives passed the Born-Alive bill. Tragically, the Senate failed to get the 60 vote procedural number necessary for its own version. The vote was 52 YEAs, 47 NAYs, 1 No Vote. Our two U.S. Senators Charles Schumer and Kirsten Gillibrand voted "NAY".

"Babies are being left to die after failed abortions, denied the care and basic human compassion. It is a stunning failure of the Senate to reject the necessary common-sense legislation, which in reality does not even limit abortion, but protects infants who are born alive." (Bsp. Daniel E. Preparation of the Priest – Part 2

A Personal Moment of Prayer for the Priest

"A clean heart create for me, God;
renew within me a steadfast spirit."

Psalm 51:12.

As we discussed last week, after the "Lamb of God," the congregation kneels down in adoration of THE Lamb of God present on the altar–Jesus Christ really, truly, and substantially present. This part of the Mass is called the private preparation of the priest for receiving Holy Communion.



For me as a priest, taking time for these prayers is one of my favorite parts of the Mass. During much of the Mass, as we have been reviewing, there are many things for the priest to do and say. I am often aware that I am praying on behalf of the people who are present. I certainly give myself the challenge of helping people understand the gift before us and pray together better.

For me, this moment is a short break where I am just praying to Jesus from my heart. Each of the prayers is truly meaningful. The first reminds me of a priest who was really influential when I was growing up. Sometimes, as an altar server, I could hear him pray these words; I was struck by his prayer asking God to help him stay faithful and never to be parted from our Lord. It sounded so humble but also confident: Lord, this is what I need, and I know You will do it. That same confidence is in the second prayer as I ask for protection and healing. The word remedy fills my heart with hope that this union with

truly bring my heart into deeper union with him... and help keep me there!



So, what should everyone else do while the priest is praying one of the above prayers? While it is just a brief moment, Charles Belmonte, the author of "Understanding the Mass," reminds us: "The personal preparation of the priest gives us the opportunity to prepare ourselves also in silence, without the noise of words but with an abundance of acts of love. We feel unworthy as the moment for receiving our Lord approaches. But we decide to go on because we know that he wants to remain in the consecrated species to be our nourishment and the cure for our weaknesses" (p. 182).

In a way similar to the priest's preparation, this is a wonderful moment to ask Jesus to strengthen you in faithfulness and purity through the gift of Holy Communion. Let us prepare fervently at this part of the Mass, for the Lord is coming to us very soon in his Flesh and Blood, the Most Holy Eucharist!

"Oh most Holy Trinity, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, I adore you profoundly. I offer Thee the most precious Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity of Jesus Christ Present in all the Tabernacles of the world. In reparation for the outrageous, sacrilegious, any indifferences by which He is offended. Amen"

For Reflection: Consider praying with the words of the priest's private prayer as a way of preparing for Mass.




