

### Father Chuck's Corner

Greetings and God's blessings be yours on the Twenty-fifth Sunday in Ordinary Time! The theme of this Sunday's readings is to emphasis that we are all called to be servants to others. In the first reading from Wisdom, we hear how the wicked will treat the Messiah. They want to test and see if he is the true promised one, even up to death. "Let us condemn him to a shameful death; for according to his own words, God will take care of him." Then in the second reading from the Letter of James, the apostle points out the contrast between those who follow Jesus and those who don't. "Beloved: Where jealousy and selfish ambition exist, there is disorder and every foul practice. But the wisdom from above is first of all pure, then peaceable, gentle, compliant, full of mercy and good fruits, without inconstancy or insincerity." And finally, in Mark's gospel Jesus is trying to teach and prepare the apostles about his impending death, but they are more concerned about which apostles will be treated more favorably. It's a bit frustrating for Jesus. His answer is very direct and has to do with being a servant to others. Jesus is not playing around. "If anyone wishes to be first, he shall be the last of all and the servant of all.'

We live in a transactional world and certainly live in a country with a transactional economy. Exchanging things of value has been around since the dawn of time. You have something I desire so I make an offer of something in return. We then decide if it is a "good deal." A lot of times it has to do with money for a service. Sometimes it is trading some stuff for other stuff. Now these types of transactions spill over into so many areas of our lives. Everything is a deal in the making, with the expectation of something in return. We do a favor for a neighbor and expect the favor to be returned at some point. We give a good sum of money to a charity and expect to be on a donor list. We volunteer for something and look for approval and admiration. We pay more attention to an attractive, rich and powerful person, in hopes we will benefit in some way down the road. Even in romantic relationships which should elicit the best of motivations we can slip into a kind of "keeping score" relationship. And then when things get too uneven, resentment seeps in.

All of us want to be appreciated, to be loved in the way we love others. But God wants more. He expects more desires more and knows we can be more. He wants us to love like we would love a helpless child. Love for the sake of loving and for no other motive. Love people we don't really like. Love those who really can't love us back, who can't trade that love with us. Love even when the exchange rate is zero. That's how God loves, without counting the cost. God never thinks, "What's in it for me?" Can't we choose to love for no other reason than to respond to the need before us? It's not going to be easy, but it is definitely worth it.

This Wednesday evening, September 25th, in keeping with the Eucharistic revival, there will be a special *Holy Hour* from 7-8pm in the church. This is a great opportunity to spend time in prayerful adoration before the Blessed Sacrament. There will be Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament, Prayer, Reflection, Music and Benediction. Join us for this time to let Jesus speak to your heart in his loving *"real presence."* 

Please remember to take home a copy of the bulletin when you leave Mass today. It contains many items of interest and invitation with something for everyone. 

#### Saint Names in Eucharistic Prayer I



As we have been reflecting on the Intercessions of the Eucharistic Prayers, perhaps it is a good time to address all those saint names in Eucharistic Prayer I. Who are all those people? Of course, the first list begins with Mary and

Joseph and then the "blessed Apostles and Martyrs," including Peter, Paul, Andrew (Peter's brother), James ("the Greater": the brother of John), John, Thomas, James ("the Lesser": the son of Alpheus), Matthew, Bartholomew, Simon ("the Zealot"), and Jude (also called Thaddeus).

#### The First List of Saint Names

Continuing this first list of saints in Eucharistic Prayer I, as the author of Understanding the Mass, Charles Belmonte notes, "Five popes head the list: St. Peter's first three successors, Linus, Cletus, Clement; then two popes of the third century, Sixtus II and Cornelius; Cyprian, Bishop of



Carthage, the intrepid defender of Catholic unity; the deacon Lawrence, who when his persecutor demanded from him the 'treasures' of the Church, showed him hundreds of poor people; Chrysogonus, a Roman priest who carried out the holy work of comforting the Christians who were in prison; two brothers, John and Paul, both officers of the [Roman] imperial palace, who were put to death under [the emperor] Julian the Apostate; and lastly, Cosmas and Damian, two Oriental physicians who gave their aid freely, and at whose graves there occurred 'yet more cures than they had effected in their lives'" (Understanding the Mass, p. 158).

#### The Second List of Saint Names

As for the second list of saints in Eucharistic Prayer I, we ask for "some share in the fellowship" of several saints who were martyrs. Belmonte continues, "It mentions, in the first place, John (here obviously St. John the Baptist), and then seven men, followed by seven women, all martyrs. Stephen is the first deacon, whose glorious

martyrdom is recounted in the Acts of the Apostles (6:8-7:60). Two apostles come next: Matthias, elected to take the place of Judas (Acts 1:15-16) and probably left out of the first list so as not to exceed the number of twelve, and Barnabas, St. Paul's companion in



his first missionary journey. Ignatius is the famous bishop of Antioch, sentenced to be fed to the wild beasts in Rome under [emperor] Trajano. Besides their names and the place of their martyrdom, little else is known of Alexander, the priest Marcellinus, and the exorcist Peter, who were all put to death in the great persecution of [emperor] Diocletian. The list continues with the names of the two young girls, Felicity and Perpetua (their names form the expression 'everlasting happiness'), who confessed their faith at Carthage [in North Africa]; and of Agatha and Lucy in Sicily. It concludes with the names of two young martyrs beloved by the Romans, Agnes and Cecelia; and of Anastasia, martyred at Sirmium and later honored in Rome" (Understanding the Mss, pp. 159–160).

Now that we have introduced the Four Pillars of Mission, we now offer some ideas how to apply them to your life.

#### PILLAR 2 – EUCHARISTIC IDENTITY

Practical Suggestions for Practicing the Corporal and Spiritual Works of Mercy

The Corporal Works of Mercy are kind acts by which we help our neighbors with their everyday material and physical needs.



#### Clothe the Naked:

- Go through your drawers and closets and find goodcondition clothes and shoes to donate to agencies that provide assistance for those in need.
- Volunteer or support the work of the St. Vincent de Paul Society.
- Coordinate a clothing drive to collect gently used clothing for local shelters or charitable organizations.
- Participate in programs that provide towels and linens for hospitals in distressed areas.
- Sponsor a family by providing them with new clothing items. Work with local charities or schools to identify families in need and deliver clothing directly.
- Assemble care packages containing clothing items like socks, underwear, and outerwear. Distribute these packages to homeless individuals or low-income families in your community.
- Volunteer to work at a clothing drive or at a shelter where clothing is distributed to those in need.




