

Father Chuck's Corner

Greetings and God's blessings be with you on the Twenty-third Sunday in Ordinary Time! Today's scripture focus is to encourage us to stay strong and not to be afraid. In the first reading from the prophet Isaiah, the people are told right from the outset: "Say to those whose hearts are frightened: Be strong, **fear not!**" Then in the second reading from the Letter of James, the apostle wants his hearers to have open eyes and ears in order to hear and see God's action in their lives. Too often we may miss the signs of God acting in our lives just like the early Christians did. That's why James says, "Did not God chose those who are poor in the world to be rich in faith and heirs of the kingdom that he promised to those who love him?" And finally, Mark's gospel has a healing miracle of Jesus that truly astounded the people. Using some spittle and the words "Ephphatha" Jesus cures the deaf mute of his infirmity. "They were exceedingly astonished, and they said, 'He has done all things well. He makes the deaf hear and the mute speak."

We all make rankings of things. Ranking requires making distinctions. We do this in lighthearted ways about sports figures, television shows, movies, singers etc... It can even be fun to try to get things in some kind of exact right order. Now these things don't really matter, they are just superficial things reflecting a personal taste. But there are other times when we have to make distinctions that do really matter. Deciding who gets the job offer, judging who performed best in a sporting event, deciding which agency gets the most funding. These are just several examples of important distinctions. Yet James challenges this practice: "Have you not made distinctions among yourselves and become judges with evil designs?" We also make distinctions about people. Those we will do everything for and those we will do some things for and those we will help only in emergencies. And what about the distinctions about who to date and maybe even marry? Yes, making distinctions is both practical and necessary. So why is Jame strong in his caution, even using "evil" as a motive? Well, often our behavior towards others is not very consistent. We are attracted to the people who can do something for us. They get our best selves. But those we don't have much use for?

They get our crabby, impatient and sometimes cruel selves. Some people get a lot of love, some little and some almost none at all. There are many people in our lives who we need in some way and they rank high but then there are people way down the list whose cries fall on deaf ears.

The deaf mut in today's gospel had people willing to help him, care for him and advocate for him. They saw an opportunity to show him love and that combined with the power and compassion of Jesus changed him forever. His ears were opened that day, but it was the open hearts of those who brought him there who brought about the miracle we still talk about to this day. God has no lists, no rankings. He loves each of us the same. Sounds crazy because we don't act this way. But that's how God is and how he sees and how he acts. And that's what he expects from us. "Be opened" was said two thousand years ago and said to us this very day.

All registered parishioners recently received a mailing that I authorized from Ocean Financial, the Catholic credit union located in Oceanside.

It is where St. Raymond Church does the bulk of our parish banking. They were the only bank that helped us secure PPP funding during the Covid 19 crisis. We receive quarterly checks as part of their Revenue Sharing Program. If you are looking for an alternative way to do your personal or family banking, I urge you to consider Ocean Financial. 

Offering

Continuing through the parts of the Eucharistic Prayer, this week we look at the Oblation, where the Church "offers the unblemished sacrificial Victim in the Holy Spirit to the Father... as well as our very selves" (GIRM, 79). We certainly have a lot to be excited about, especially Holy Communion, which is coming. Lest we lose focus and let our attention fade, the prayers that follow the Memorial Acclamation help us to recall the Mass as the one perfect sacrifice, as well as our participation in that sacrifice.



Placing Ourselves on the Altar with Christ

Perhaps you will recognize these words from Eucharistic Prayer I: "We, your servants and your holy people, offer to your glorious majesty from the gifts that you have given us, this pure victim, this holy victim, this spotless victim, the holy Bread of eternal life and the Chalice of everlasting salvation." According to the Diocese of Peoria, "As we offer to God the gifts, we offer to Him ourselves-as Christ did, we offer Him our very lives. As we offer ourselves, we do so with the entire Church, here on earth and in heaven, and we ask that we, too, may share in their fellowship... Our praise and worship is always united with theirs, as the entire Church is present at every Mass" ("A Study of the Mass," p. 16). As we hear in Eucharistic Prayer II, "Have mercy on us all, we pray, that with the Blessed Virgin Mary, Mother of God, with blessed Joseph, her Spouse, with the blessed Apostles, and all the Saints who have pleased you throughout the ages, we may merit to be coheirs to eternal life, and may praise and glorify you through your Son, Jesus Christ."

This offering also reminds us: "We are not mere spectators; we are participants. Even though it is the priest who offers these prayers in the name of the community, all present at the Mass can offer their silent prayers with the priest. This is a most opportune time to 'place our intentions on the paten' and unite our offering with our Lord" ("A Study of the Mass," p. 16). You may recall how previously we shared that Mother Teresa would imagine placing her heart and intentions on the paten on the altar. What Mother Teresa understood was

that at this time of the Mass, all the eyes of heaven are focused on the altar before us. With all the saints and angels gathered around giving glory to God, they are praying with us and for us, making this time a great moment to be joined together with Christ.

Offering Ourselves to God



The Eucharistic Prayers remind us that we not only offer our prayers in union with Jesus, the perfect offering, but we also offer ourselves to God: all that we are and all that we have to give, both to God and to others. This part of the Mass reminds us that we participate in the life of Jesus and that we should live out that participation every day. The author, Charles Belmonte, writes, "Following the footprints of Jesus, our life becomes a prolonged Mass. Here is a summary or program of life by which we can achieve this ideal:

- To remember Christ's passion and death. It delivered us from the real evil—sin; and merited for us all true good.
- · To experience constantly the joy of his resurrection.
- To proclaim his resurrection and ascension, through our words and deeds.
- To center our day on this holy sacrifice, while we look forward to Christ's coming" (Understanding the Mass, p. 147).

So, instead of thinking about that nice meal that is going to follow the Mass, the fun day you have planned, or even what the next week will look like, why not thank God for the gift of Jesus present and remind ourselves to "live out the Mass"? In that mindset, maybe the meal or fun activity becomes a joyful offering. Maybe our work week or school schedule becomes a sacrificial offering. How different might our work be if, instead of putting in the time or getting our homework done, we are joined with Christ in making an offering to God?

For Reflection: As you make your plans for the day or week, reflect on what follows immediately after your participation in Mass and how to bring the graces you have received into the rest of your day.

Practical Suggestions for Practicing the Corporal and Spiritual Works of Mercy

The Corporal Works of Mercy are kind acts by which we help our neighbors with their everyday material and physical needs.

Feed the Hungry:

- · See to the proper nutrition of your loved ones,
- Support and volunteer for food pantries, soup kitchens, and agencies that feed the hungry.
- Make a few sandwiches to hand out as you walk through areas where you might encounter people in need.
- Educate yourself about world hunger.
- Avoid wasting food.
- · Share your meals with others.

Shelter the Homeless:

- · Help neighbors care for their homes and do repairs.
- · Support and/or volunteer at a homeless shelter.
- Support and/or volunteer for charitable agencies who care for the homeless, build homes, and provide support in the wake of natural disasters.
- · Advocate for public policies and legislation that provide housing for low-income people.
- · Consider becoming a foster parent.

The Corporal Works of Mercy in Real Life

Disciples share where they see and participate in the corporal works of mercy in their lives:

Homeless Shelter Volunteer: "Every year, our Church participates in a local rotating "warming shelter" for the homeless who seek reprieve from the bitter Michigan winters. It lasts about a week and volunteers help to make up cots, provide warm food, engage in conversation and give mercy through the sheltering of the homeless. I took the opportunity to volunteer a couple of years back and the experience was transformative. Being able to touch the pain and suffering of another human being brings us back to the most basic sense of human dignity and human connection. God's grace was given and received in abundance in St. Mary's grade school gym as I sought to know and remember the names, details, struggles and stories of those I was serving."

Social Ministry Volunteer: "It is truly a gift from God to serve those in need of comfort. We ran a food pantry with two people. We ran (literally, based on volume) food orders outside to cars so people could stay safe and warm. Seniors were isolating to stay safe, and were so lonely and sad. We visited porches in all seasons and dropped food and prayers off. We made phone calls and joyful cards (by parishioners of all ages), and we had a drive-thru gift drop-off celebration. We zoomed and provided fellowship to people who hadn't seen anyone in months. There were many funerals and bereaved families, which prompted the need for grace, mercy and comfort. Your heart grows past capacity when people are hurting and you find a new way to show Jesus' love to those trying to cope. I am so grateful for the opportunity to be called to grow and change to serve my brothers and sisters."

A Christian who is living the mission of a disciple is one who believes in Jesus, who knows Jesus, who can't live without Jesus, and who wants to share with others the love, peace, and joy that he has experienced as a result of living in relationship with Jesus.
