Father Chuck's Corner

Greetings and God's blessings be yours on the Thirty-second Sunday in Ordinary Time! This Sunday we celebrate God's care and faithfulness to all those who trust in him. In the first reading from I Kings, we see the prophet Elijah acting as a vessel of God's care for his people through the poor widow who had no food. In that time God's people were a mess, mired in disobedience, idolatry and unfaithfulness. Elijah was sent to lead the people to repentance. "For the Lord, the God of Israel, says: 'The jar shall not go empty, nor the jug of oil run dry, until the day when the Lord sends rain upon the earth."' Then in the second reading from Hebrews, Jesus is seen as the Savior, sent by the heavenly Father to save us. "Christ did not enter into a sanctuary made by hands, a copy of the true one, but heaven itself, that he might now appear before God on our behalf." And finally, in Mark's gospel Jesus sets a stark example of discipleship before the apostles when he comments on the poor widow making a small donation in the temple. "Amen, I say to you, this poor widow put in more than all the other contributors to the treasury." This was because the poor widow gave from her poverty and not from any wealth. She gave from what she did not have.

I think it's safe to say that it is not fun when things run out. Think of the gas in your tank or the battery on your phone, or your electric car. Then there is milk or juice in the fridge or the time clock in a sports game. Maybe it's propane for the grill or formula or diapers. Even worse, maybe money in your checking account. You name it, there are all sorts of things that cause us problems when we run out of them. Today's scriptures tell stories of some people who act differently when they don't seem to have enough. And they are both widows. They were probably living uncertain lives, maybe in desperate situations, not sure of making it day to day. And yet, *they both gave!* The widow in the first reading is down to her last bit of flour. Yet she doesn't make excuses or refuse Elijah. Rather she simply trusted in her God. Then the poor widow in the gospel gives a near worthless two small coins to the temple treasury. She probably had really nothing to support herself but that didn't stop her from giving the little she did have.

I think all of us should think about the things we have. Whose are they? What are they for? How attached should we be to them? These are not comfortable questions. Why? Because most of us would not have made the choices that the two widows did in today's readings. We never want anything to run out, never want to get to the point where we don't have the things we need or want that make our lives better and more secure. Simply put, we are afraid that everything is in short supply. Today, we are challenged to accept a much different reality. Do we believe in a God of abundance. Do we believe that the things we need to do what God wants us to do will never be in short supply? Things like compassion, tolerance, patience, kindness, generosity and mercy? True giving, like for the widow in the gospel comes from our want and always costs something. But somehow, God-things never run out. Why? Because our God is a God of free refills. He will always keep us filled to the brim and overflowing with every good thing he wants for us and from us. We just have to ask.

Please remember to take home a copy of the bulletin when you leave Mass today. It contains many items of interest and invitation, with something for everyone. Of special note is news and needs from Parish Social Ministry, info from Religious Education (Faith Formation), an order form for the special One Year Memorial Candles that begin in Advent, invitations to join the St. **Raymond Adult Choir and St. Raymond Folk** Group, the Eucharistic Revival Centerfold, the Communal Prayer Before Mass (found on the inside back cover of the bulletin), an invitation to join *FORMED* (your Catholic Faith on demand and much more. To keep informed, keep a copy of the bulletin at home each week for quick and easy reference.

Have a great week. Smile, share and give from your want. And don't forget to honor all our military veterans on Monday, November 11th for Veterans Day. Plus remember: When you hit rock bottom, God is the rock at the bottom. God bless always. -Father Chuck

She left to get it, and he called out after her, "Please bring along a bit of bread." She answered, "As the LORD, your God, lives, I have nothing baked; there is only a handful of flour in my jar and a little oil in my jug. Just now I was collecting a couple of sticks, to go in and prepare something for myself and my son; when we have eaten it, we shall die." Elijah said to her, "Do not be afraid. Go and do as you propose. But first make me a little cake and bring it to me. Then you can prepare something for yourself and your son. For the LORD, the God of Israel, says, 'The jar of flour shall not go empty, nor the jug of oil run dry, until the day when the LORD sends rain upon the earth." She left and did as Elijah had said. 2024 EUCHARISTIC PROCESSION - NYC

"It is Jesus that you seek when you dream of happiness, he is waiting for you when nothing else you find satisfies you."

These words by Pope St. John Paul II were truly present in New York City a couple of weeks ago when 5,000 people including myself and hundreds of young people adorned St. Patrick Cathedral. After mass and a holy hour we processed out by bringing Jesus to the millions of New York City. Through the hustle and bustle of NYC from the heights of the tallest skyscrapers, you could not find happiness. Where could you find happiness? You could find it in a little tiny white circle. That is where happiness is found. We gathered in community and processed in prayer, song, and worship. This demonstration did not only touch my life and the 5,000 assembled, it also touched the lives of the 9 million people of the city.

We come together in a secular world to learn together how to bring happiness in the 21st century through modern evangelization. This is what the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB) have been trying to teach us for the last three years. Over the last three years the bishops have begun a Eucharistic Revival. Through this new evangelization, we come together to show that Jesus is truly present in that "holy cookie" we receive at mass as it was explained to me by a young student one day. As we processed out of St. Patrick's Cathedral I meditated on the phrase that the priest or deacon says before they end mass

"Go forth and announce the Gospel of the Lord".

This phase shows our mission to bring Jesus to the world. During the holy hour we had the opportunity to venerate the Left Ventricle of soon to be Saint Blessed Carlo Acutis. When the priest who is in charge of his cause for canonization blessed me with the relic he said, "From this day know you can be a saint." This is our end goal to be united with Christ in heaven as a saint. How do we achieve that goal? Let's look at Blessed Carlo who died just a little younger than me when he said, "The Eucharist is my highway to heaven." When we receive the Eucharist, we don't only eat the bread we put on Christ, we become Christ. This means living life like Christ will bring us to our goal. It was truly uplifting to attend this service. It was also empowering to see the hundreds of young people who were able to attend. No matter what age, race, gender, we must come united to make Him known, loved, and served.




Communal Prayer Before Mass
