Father Chuck's Corner

Greetings and God's blessings be yours on the Fifteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time! The theme of today's readings calls us to realize that we have all been blessed with every spiritual blessing in the heavens. In the first reading Amos defends himself against the accusations of Amaziah, the priest of bethel, who wanted him gone from the land. "The Lord took me from following the flock and said to me: Go prophesy to me people Israel." Then in the second reading from the letter to the Ephesians, Paul connects us with heaven. That is our destiny and we have been given all the blessings necessary to achieve this goal. "In love he destined us for adoption to himself through Jesus Christ, in accord with the favor of his will, for the praise of the glory of his grace that he grated us in the beloved." And finally, Mark's gospel tells us of the time Jesus sent out the Twelve Apostles to see how much they had learned. He wanted to give them a foretaste of what their mission would be like after he was gone. They had explicit instructions and so they went off preaching repentance. "The Twelve drove out many demons, and they anointed with oil many who were sick and cured them."

Doing the work of Jesus can be intimidating, even scary at times. Most of us wonder if we have what it takes. Will I act the right way? Will I say the right things? Will I make a difference? Will I be accepted or rejected? Or is the job too difficult, a bad fit, and I'm definitely unqualified? So, what do we need? Well, Jesus said to the Twelve three things. Take a walking stick, a tunic and sandals. Was that all they needed? Seems so. What would those things provide? A tunic provides warmth, especially when it is cold. A walking stick provides balance and protection. And sandals give us something to plant our feet firmly on, a proper foundation. So, we have warmth, balance and security. All we need is for God to accompany us on our journey. God is like the walking stick providing us with support, someone to lean on when facing life's challenges who will keep us safe from dangers and pitfalls. God is also like the tunic, making sure we stay warm on cold nights, those times when our enthusiasm, motivation and courage begin to wane. God is that fire within us to inspire and encourage us to keep moving in the right direction. And God is also like the sandals, the one who wants to be the firm foundation for all we do and all we say and all we are. He's the one we rest on and who brings peace to every step we take. So, go forth in baptismal grace, living your life in Jesus knowing that you have all you need, and that God is with you every step of the way.

Sanctus

Last time, we took a closer look at the Preface, which in many ways sets the tone for the Eucharistic Prayer. At the end of the Preface, as the Diocese of Peoria teaches, "we join with the choirs of heaven in singing the endless song of praise. The Second Vatican Council teaches that the Liturgy is both a foretaste and promise of the heavenly Liturgy. The Liturgy on earth is united to the Liturgy in heaven, and this is made vividly clear when we join them in song. 'Holy, Holy, Holy' is a heavenly superlative acclamation of praise and worship" ("A Study of the Mass," p. 13).



A Foretaste of Heaven

This next part of the Mass is called the Sanctus, perhaps more commonly referred to as the Holy, Holy, Holy. As is true with many parts of the Mass, we can find these words in the Holy Scriptures. The prophet Isaiah saw a vision of the Lord on a throne with angels singing, "Holy, holy, holy, is the Lord of hosts!" (Is. 6:3). In St. John's vision of heaven, the four living creatures continuously exclaim, "Holy, holy, holy is the Lord God almighty, who was, and who is, and who is to come" (Rev. 4:8). Perhaps we will also recognize the second part of the Sanctus from the entry of Jesus into Jerusalem on Palm Sunday: "Hosanna to the Son of David; blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord; hosanna in the highest" (Mt. 21:9). Charles Belmonte, the author of Understanding the Mass, recalls how the Sanctus reminds us of the beautiful presence of the angels at the Mass: "We join our own voices with those of the hosts of angels in awe, wonderment, and great enthusiasm... St. John Chrysostom describes the presence of angels during the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass with these words: 'The angels surround the priest; all the temple, especially the sanctuary, is populated with celestial hosts of angels who honor God, present on the altar" Have you ever thought of this? In a very real way, the Sanctus helps to remind us that our participation in the Mass is truly a foretaste of heaven. When we gather as the Body of Christ for the

present there! That means every member of the Christian faithful is present with us—all those around the world, all those from various times (including those who have gone before us), and all those who are gathered together in heaven around the throne of God... including the heavenly hosts of angels! Imagine telling your friends on Monday: "All the angels of heaven were at my church on Sunday!" It's true!



Singing with the Angels

With this wonderful image in mind, when we sing the Sanctus, we are joining in the praise the angels are singing for God. What exactly is this song of praise? Charles Belmonte relates that a certain "Cardinal Bona (seventeenth century) explains that this hymn contains three praises and two petitions: First, we extol the holiness, power, and supreme dominion of God, when we say, 'Holy, Holy, Holy Lord, God of [hosts].' Then, we praise his glory which shines forth in all creatures, when we say, 'Heaven and earth are full of your glory.' Third, we laud Christ by saying, 'Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord.' While saying this, we invite him to come to our souls with the same affection and devotion with which his Blessed Mother received him at the annunciation. The two petitions are: 'Hosanna in the highest;' we say it twice, asking for our salvation and everything that leads to it. The first petition is addressed to God, and the second to Christ" (Understanding the Mass, p. 133-134).

If praising the Lord with the angels is this exciting, just imagine how joyful we will be when Jesus is truly and substantially present on the altar!

For Reflection:

Read slowly and prayerfully through Isaiah 6 and/or Revelation 4. Place yourself in the scene the Scripture passage describes and imagine the experience of participating in worship with the angels.

Allow this experience to inform your next participation in the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass.

Christ died on the cross to save each of us from sin and death – the supreme act of love, the ultimate gift of self. This is what love looks like. We, who are made in His image and likeness, are called to this same love, and actually find ourselves through this love. Every act of love is a participation in Jesus' act of love on the cross.

We become most truly ourselves when we allow ourselves to be conformed to the life of Christ – from His birth to His suffering and death, to His Resurrection. In His life, all of our ordinariness, trials, and joys are illumined. In His Passion, all of our sufferings and pains take on redemptive meaning. And in His Resurrection, all of our wounds are healed, and our hearts are restored. It is in Him that the truth of who we are and how we are called to love is made clear.

Deacon Larry Oney Clergy & Convert (Living †)

Deacon Larry Oney is a Permanent Deacon for the Archdiocese of New Orleans, Louisiana. He is assigned to Saint Louis King of France Cathedral in New Orleans, LA. Deacon Larry and his wife, Andi, have five children and are members of Our Lady of Grace Parish. In addition to his business career, he is also an accomplished author and radio host and, along with Andi, conducts parish retreats. Deacon Larry will be the Master of Ceremonies (MC) and Andi will be a speaker for the upcoming National Eucharistic Congress, which will be held in Indianapolis, IN, between July 17-21, 2024. What can we learn from Deacon Larry's Eucharistic witness:

Belief Intensifies Love: Deacon Larry credits Andi for his conversion in his early 20's after being invited to a Catholic retreat. It was there that he experienced a powerful desire for the Eucharist that would lead him, first to full communion with Christ in the Church, and later, to a vocation to the diaconate. Deacon Larry also credits the deacon, whom he met on that first retreat, who later would travel two hours each week to teach him the Catechism to prepare him for his Baptism, First Communion, and Confirmation.

Feeding and Being Fed by Love: "As a deacon, you get to stand beside the priest of the most high God, and witness up close, at the Epiclesis, the power of the Holy Spirit coming down to transform the bread and the wine to the body, blood, soul, and the Divinity of Jesus. It's overwhelming! I can't find the right words describe to you what a privileged it is to be there assisting the priest."

Made for Love: "At the Congress, I would encourage people to be open for the surprise of the Holy Spirit ... for outbreaks of miracles, a revival and a resurgence of the things of God. I would also ask everyone to pray for God's mercy and healing for our nation. I ask all attendees to elevate their expectations and come as pilgrims and not just as spectators."
