

Father Chuck's Corner

Greetings and God's blessings be yours on the Fourteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time! Today's readings call us all to be prophets who speak the truth of Jesus. And it is Jesus himself who gives us the courage we need to do so. In the first reading from the prophet Ezekiel, the prophet reiterates the authority of God speaking through him. "Thus says the Lord God! And whether they heed or resist-for they are a rebellious house-they shall know that a prophet has been among them." Then in the second reading from 2 Corinthians, Paul emphasizes that the power of Jesus shines through his weakness. As Jesus said to Paul: "My grace is sufficient for you, for power is made perfect in weakness." And finally, in Mark's gospel, Jesus meets some stiff resistance in his hometown. The people who knew him as he grew up were not able to accept who he had become. Their faith had a real tunnel vision. They questioned all that Jesus was doing and how could he be doing all they said about him, since he came from very humble beginnings. "So, Jesus said in response: "A prophet is not without honor except in his native place and among his own kin and in his own

Remember that when we are baptized, we are baptized as priest, prophet and king. We are a part of this ministry of Jesus. What is this ministry of prophet as it is shown in today's gospel? The prophet speaks God's truth to people. Sometimes that meant there were special prophets chosen by God to speak for him to the Israelites, usually whenever they strayed from God's way. Prophets were called to encourage people to have faith, to trust that God had not forgotten them and to have faith that God would forgive their sins and save them. We too are called to speak the truth to people when needed, to encourage where it can be helpful. And just like the Old Testament prophets, we need God's grace and strength to come through when needed.

The main thing we need to be a prophet in our time and place is to believe it in our heart, that we are truly called by God to be someone special. If we believe in God and that he created us, sustains us and loves us, then me must have a kind of faith in ourselves. Then we can be the person God calls us to be and created us to be. We all have the potential, because God dwells in us through the Holy Spirit. And it doesn't matter how ordinary we are or might feel inside.

The truth is that there is an incredible person in each of us waiting to come out. This is what our baptismal grace is all about. And remember, besides prophetic grace, there is a priestly and kingly grace to tap also. Wow!

At this time, I want to announce that the 2024 **Backwards Money Drawing has started!** The success of this parish fundraiser event is very important for the fiscal stability of the parish. 

The Preface As Thanksgiving

Last week, we took a closer look at the opening dialogue of the Preface, and especially how it invites us to give thanks to God. As we said earlier, the word Eucharist means "thanksgiving." The author of "Understanding the Mass," Charles Belmonte, indicates that the preface is an appropriate beginning of the Eucharistic prayer, since it "is basically an act of thanksgiving in a literary form between prayer and hymn. It seeks to move the faithful to praise and joy" (p. 128).

Thanksgiving for Every Day of the Year



For me as a priest, the Preface is one of my favorite parts of the Mass, especially when I take time to really pray through the phrases. The Preface is one of the variable

parts of the Mass, where there are many options that can change from week to week. Our current Missal has about 50 regularly used Prefaces grouped together, including ones for Advent, Christmas, Lent, Easter, Sundays of Ordinary Time, Feasts of the Blessed Virgin Mary and the Saints, Funerals, and some "Common" Prefaces that can be used on days where another specific Preface isn't called for. In addition to these, there are many more Prefaces in the Missal, including some specially designed for certain Eucharistic Prayers and those that are used on specific celebrations such as Christ the King or the Most Holy Trinity. There are even some special Prefaces for civic holidays, such as Thanksgiving or the Fourth of July in the United States. Each of these Prefaces will highlight special truths of a particular celebration or season of the year.

Following the response of the people in the Preface dialogue, "It is right and just," I enjoy how the priest begins praying the Preface with, "It is truly right and just." We are encouraging each other in giving thanks. These words of the priest communicate, "Yes! Let us continue giving thanks—it is right and just!" I often will pray those words with emphasis, as we transition to the next part of the Preface that will highlight special truths for us.

Special Truths Proclaimed in the Preface

For example, Preface I of Advent says, "For he assumed at his first coming the lowliness of human flesh, and so fulfilled the design you formed long ago, and opened for us the way to eternal salvation, that, when he comes again in glory and majesty and all is at last made manifest, we who watch for that day may inherit the great promise in which now we dare to hope." As another example, in Preface I of the Most Holy Eucharist, we hear, "For he is the true and eternal Priest, who instituted the pattern of an everlasting sacrifice and was the first to offer himself as the saving Victim, commanding us to make this offering as his memorial. As we eat his flesh that was sacrificed for us, we are made strong, and, as we drink his Blood that was poured out for us, we are washed clean." Since they are so good, and since we are



in the Eucharistic Revival, here are the key phrases from Preface II of the Most Holy Eucharist, "For at the Last Supper with his Apostles, establishing for the ages to come the saving memorial of the Cross, he offered himself to you as the unblemished Lamb, the acceptable gift of perfect praise. Nourishing your faithful

by this sacred mystery, you make them holy, so that the human race, bounded by one world, may be enlightened by one faith and united by one bond of charity. And so, we approach the table of this wondrous Sacrament, so that, bathed in the sweetness of your grace, we may pass over to the heavenly realities here foreshadowed." No doubt, those are prayers packed with great truths! If we aren't attentive to this part of the Mass, we could really miss out on some great highlights that help ready our hearts for the ultimate prayer of thanksgiving—the Holy Eucharist—the perfect sacrifice of Jesus offered to the Father. The Preface is a great summary of the celebration of the day, and a fitting preparation for the rest of the Eucharistic Prayer to come!

How to participate in the Eucharistic Revival

Here's a few ideas to get you started.

This month, tens of thousands of Catholics will gather in Indianapolis to worship our Risen Lord in His humble Presence in the Eucharist. What's happening? Why are crowds of Catholics descending upon this midwestern city? They're answering the Church's call for a revival.

Three years ago, the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB) called for a movement committed to rekindling a living relationship with the Eucharist. This desire to reconsecrate our nation to the Real Presence has led to a National Eucharistic Revival—which will culminate in the National Eucharistic Congress this month. The mission of this revival should be close to the heart of every Catholic. However, not everyone can make it to Indianapolis this summer. So how do we participate if we can't travel?

Here are a few ideas to do your own personal Eucharistic Revival:

- Spend more time with Our Lord in Adoration and the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass. Any time the church is open, you can spend time before Christ present in the tabernacle.
- Spend time slowly reading and meditating on Bible Verses about the Eucharist. The power of reading the Gospels is, the very same Jesus who you are reading about in the Gospels, is same Jesus is spending time with you now and teaching you how to be his disciple today.
 - o Mark 14:22-24, Luke 22:19-20, John 6:35, John 6:51-58, Acts 2:46-47, 1 Corinthians 10:16-17, 1 Corinthians 11:28-29, and John 15:5.
- Explore your Eucharistic Faith by watching the free, 7part video series Jesus and the Eucharist, a dynamic series designed to help you fall deeper in love with our Eucharistic Lord. The video series can be found at the National Eucharistic Revival's website:

USCCB Committee on Catechesis and Evangelization. She was part of the planning committee and will be one of the speakers for the upcoming National Eucharistic Congress, which will be held in Indianapolis, IN, between July 17-21, 2024. What can we learn from Julianne's Eucharistic witness:

Belief Intensifies Love: "There are many touchstone moments in my journey with the Eucharist. One was when I was baking bread with my children. The process of kneading the dough, which in a way is a violent process, reminded me of Jesus' life from Good Friday to Easter. That the gathering of His life culminated in one of the most violent acts, the kneading of His body with the world's sins before He could rise. This changed things for me at Mass as the Host, the body of Jesus, was being elevated. I realized that, when Jesus said that His body broken for us, the priest physically breaks apart the Eucharist. We must remember that, when we think the Church is falling apart or when our lives are difficult, the Church and we are being broken open so that that new life can come out."

Feeding and Being Fed by Love: At the Congress, Julianne will present at a panel discussion entitled "Rooted in the Eucharist: Living the Mission of the National Eucharistic Revival" as well give a keynote speech. "In my talk, I want to go into the heart of the Jesus as the Good Shepherd. Jesus, who reaches out to save the lost, the lonely, the angry the desperate, the hurting, is here for us to offer that renewal that only happens by his grace by connecting with his heart."

Made for Love: "I hope that the Catholics that attend the Congress, will take that spark of renewal, look at their parishes, and say we can have this Spirit of the Congress right here. I think it's a blessing to have this huge opportunity and a unique missionary moment."




